QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

State of Kentucky , Franklin Co.

On the 21st day of December 1838 personally appeared before John McKee esqr. a justice of the peace for the county and state aforesaid Rebecca Hawkins a resident of the said county and state aged seventy six years, who being first- duly sworn according to law; doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by Act of Congress passed July 4, 1836. That she is the widow of Reuben Hawkins deceased who was a soldier in the war of the revolution and as such enlisted for a term of two years in the County of Orange and state of Virginia. Under Capt. Francis Taylor and in the regiment of Colonel John Spotswood. She cannot state precisely at what time her husband enlisted, but she knows it was on the same day that Elisha Hawkins did enlist and for the same term, and that they belonged to the same company and regiment. Said Elisha was a pensioner of the United States till his death, which took place in November 1822, and resided in Franklin County and drew his pension at the agency in Lexington, Kentucky; by reference to whose declaration the day of her deceased husband's enlistment will accurately appear. She knows that her husband was a an officer during his revolutionary service, and that while he belonged to the army, he did occasionally engage in the County of Orange and the surrounding counties as a recruiting officer , dressed in his regimentals; and that twice, if not oftener, he took his recruits up to the army and again returned upon that business. She stated that her husband was either an Ensign or Lieutenant for the whole time of his service, or at least from a day or two after his enlistment till he left the American Army. She states that her said husband served faithfully from the time of his enlistment until sometime in the winter after his marriage, but what time precisely she cannot now recall. She further states that her said husband was in the County of Orange engaged as a recruiting officer at the time he courted her, and that they were married by Parson Mary of the Church of England in August seventeen hundred and seventy eight, but on what day of the month she cannot now certainly recollect. She states that her said husband Reuben Hawkins died in the month of August 1812 that she has no family record of her marriage, and knows of no record witness of the said marriage anywhere. She further states that she well recollecth that in the fall after her said marriage with the said Reuben Hawkins deceased, that he took his recruits to the army. That she went with him upon that occasion, as far as Fredericksburg, Virginia and that during the remaining Winter he resigned and came home to Orange County where they resided. She does not know what has become of her said husband's discharge. She thinks it was lost by him during his life. She has remained a widow ever since the death of her said husband, as will now fully appear by reference to the proof herto annexed.

Rebecca Hawkins her X mark

The deposition of Jehu Hawkins aged eighty two years taken at the house of William Hawkins in the County of Woodford on the 29th day of October 1838, who being first duly sworn, upon oath states, that he recollecth distinctly that Reuben Hawkins, deceased, whose widow, Rebecca Hawkins, now resides in Franklin Co, Ky, enlisted in the war of the revolution for two years, in the company of Capt. Francis Taylor of Orange County, VA. He does not now recollecth at what time said Hawkins enlisted but he knows that it was at the early stage of the revolutionary war, and he is certain that it was in the first company of regulars that was raised in Orange County, but he does not know whither he was in the continental service, or the service of the state of Virginia. According to the best of deponent's recollection said Reuben Hawkins was a sergeant from the commencement of his service; but he knows that some short time after he left Orange County with his company, that he returned to said county, dressed in regimentals, as a recruiting officer but whether he held the office of Lieutenant or Ensign when he returned to Orange, deponent cannot now recollect. Though he is certain it was one or the other. He knows that said Hawkins was engaged as a recruiting officer, in the counties of Orange, Culpeper, Louisa and other counties in that part of Virginia for some time and he recollecth that he took his first recruits on to the army, and again returned, and was engaged for sometime in enlisting soldiers, and whilst thus engaged in collecting these sworn parcels for recruits, he courted his wife, the said Rebecca Hawkins, and was married to in the County of Spotsylvania, Virginia, at the house of the Parson, near old Mr. Edwards, her father's. Deponent was present and witnessed their marriage, and knows it was during the war of the revolution, but at what time he cannot now recollect. He knows however that said Reuben Hawkins, deceased, was married in his regimentals, and whilst he was engaged as an officer in the recruiting service of the county; but how long after his marriage it was before said R. Hawkins left the army he cannot recollect. He recollecth that Elisha Hawkins, deceased -- the brother of Reuben, enlisted at the same time and in the same company with Reuben, for two years that he served out his term, and was a pensioner of the government till his death, which took place four or five years ago, and he is strongly impressed with the belief, that when Elisha left the army and returned home, that Reuben was still in the army holding the commission of Ensign or Lieutenant. He does not know whither Reuben continued all the time he was in the army in the company of Capt. Taylor, or not; for after he first left home in the service (when deponent saw him during his service) he was in Orange and the surrounding counties, engaged as a recruiting officer enlisting men, and taking them on to the army. His recollection is now too frail to speak positively as to time or dates, but he thinks he is not mistaken in saying that said Reuben Hawkins was engaged more than twelve months as a recruiting officer as aforesaid.

Sworn and subscribed before Bernard Gaines Esquire, a justice of the peace for the County of Woodford and State of Kentucky this day and year first above written.

REUBIN HAWKINS this 15th of September 1848 at Home in Mercer County, Kentucky. This is my last will and testament for the act of my last will I bequeath or give to my daughter, Emeline Hurst, one negro boy name, Andy, her life time and at her death he is to go to Harmon Hurst and his children after him. I bequeath or give to my granddaughter, Elizabeth Jane Hurst, two negro boys, John and Dick and one negro girl name, Margret, to her and her children forever and if she dies without a living child they go to her brothers and sisters and their children forever, and I give her one bed, bedsted and bed clothing, one beauro and my small clock in my room and one big spinning wheel, and her rone Mare, bridle and saddle and one milch cow. I likewise give to Elizabeth Jane Hurst my Chaplin farm containing one hundred and thirty one or two acres, my Tom Rite farm to be hers forever and her children after her and if she dies without a living child it is to go to her living brothers and sisters and their children of the theirs forever. I give and bequeath to my grandson, Reubin Rowen Hurst, after my death my home farm where I now live on Salt River, containing one hundred and thirty two acres of land and I leave R. R. Hurst the balance of my negroes, eight in number, and after paying off my just debts the balance of the negroes left, is to be said R. Hurst's forever and his children after him and if he R. R. Hurst dies without a living child the land, negroes goes to his living brothers and sisters and their children of the theirs forever and ever. I also leave to R. R. Hurst all my moveable property of every description, Horses, Cattle, Hogs, Sheep and every thing else that is on the farm to sell to pay off my just debts. What ever my wife and R. R. Hurst _____ of the farm and in the house to sell and apply to paying the debts the said R. R. Hurst is to pay all my debts out of the property I leave him and my wife is to live on the farm she now lives on as long as she lives and she is to keep what house and kitchen furniture she wants. All I leave to Rowen Hurst is to be subject to my wife's maintenance and she is to be maintained plentiful as long as she lives on the farm I leave to said R. R. Hurst and to have a negro to wait on her when she wants one and R. R. Hurst is to pay my grandson, James Hurst, one hundred dollars in five years after said Rowen gets the property in his hands and I leave my grand daughter, Nancy Hurst, one hundred dollars in the Harrodsburg turnpike road to be hers at my death. Now I don't want no court nor Jury to _____ this my last will and testament. Everything I own I got myself with my own labor I therefore had a right to write this my present will, wholly written with my own hand, is signed and sealed with my own arms.

As the boy Dick is deceased I leave my girl, Hanner, to Elizabeth Jane Hurst, my granddaughter also I leave R. R. Hurst and my wife, Elizabeth Hawkins and Merrel Williams my administrators to my last will and testament, June 7 day 1851.

The foregoing last will and testament of Reuben Hawkins, deceased, was this day produced into Court and proved by Isaac Gray and E. Magoffin, two subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God, Amen, I, MOSES HAWKINS of the County of Franklin in State of Kentucky, being of sound and perfect mind do make this my last will and testament in the manner following:

That all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid and satisfied.

I give my tract of land lying on the East side of Cedar Run Branch to my son, Burns M. Hawkins, and all on the West side, except the lot adjoining my son, Jeptha, and one fourth of an acre, including the graveyard which I give to my relatives as a burial ground.

I give one yoke of oxen and wagon to my son Burns, above named, by his paying my estate one hundred dollars.

I give those things to him to enable him to support and take care of my daughter, Elizabeth M. Hawkins, while she remains single or unmarried.

The lot of land adjoining my son, Jeptha, I give to him.

The balance of my estate, I leave to my four daughters:

Susanna E., wife of Cornelius Brown, Agnes Ann, wife of R. H. Hawkins, Sara Rebecca, wife of Jesse Brown, Elizabeth M. Hawkins, to be equally divided between them.

I request of or require, my son, Burns, to keep and take care of two head of cattle, for my daughter, Elizabeth M. Hawkins.

And lastly, I appoint my son, Burns M. Hawkins, my executor, to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal.

I do not require my son to give security for the performances of his executor duties.

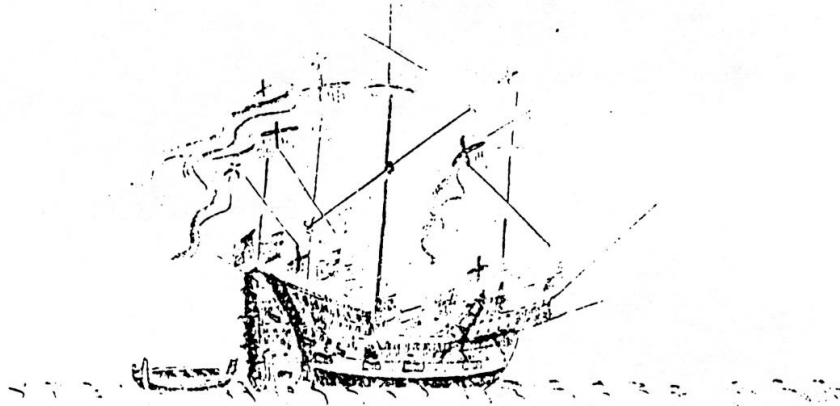

A writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Moses Hawkins, deceased, was produced in court and was proven by the oaths of J. S. Hawkins and William W. Wright, the subscribing witnesses thereto, whereupon it was ordered that the same will be recorded, which is done.

The deposition of William B. Hawkins of Franklin County, Kentucky taken on the 21st day of December 1838 who being sworn upon oath states that he is the second child of Rebecca Hawkins, who has made the declaration and Rueben Hawkins, deceased. That he will be fifty eight years old on the 26th day of February next as he has always understood from his deceased father and mother, and of which he had no doubt- his father, Reuben Hawkins died in August eighteen hundred and twelve, and his mother, the said Rebecca Hawkins, has remained a widow single and unmarried ever since said period. Sworn to and subscribed this day and year above written.

ARCULUS COBLER HAWKINS

1808 - 1895



My g.g.grandfather, Arculus Cobler Hawkins, was born May 30, 1808 in Orange County, Virginia. At a fairly young age he moved with family members to Kentucky and then on to Ralls County, Missouri. On January 19, 1830 he married Cornelia Catharine Lamme. Her parents were William T. and Frances Callaway Lamme. Frances' mother was Daniel Boone's daughter, Jemima.

In a handwritten manuscript found among old Hawkins family papers, Mrs. James Bunting relates the following:

"Mr. Arculus Hawkins left Missouri May 28, 1852 and arrived in California in September of the same year.

"He with his wife and family, which consisted of four boys and one girl,

namely Duff, Catharine, Arculus, Creath and Granville. Very shortly after coming to this state they settled on Sweeney Creek where Mr. Hawkins was making preparations to remain by building a house for the family and also sheds for his cattle. Mr. Hawkins brought 300 head of cattle from Missouri with him which he intended to winter on Sweeney Creek. When the rainy season came on, every place was nothing but mud to which the cattle had a most decided objection for one morning when the men went out to attend to them, not one head of stock could be found near the place. An immediate search was made for the missing animals. After several hours of diligent search, they were all found in one place peacefully resting under a beautiful oak tree which is now standing in the garden of this beautiful family homestead, and measures 20 feet in circumference.

"Mr. Hawkins being a broad-minded man on general principles, seeing that his cattle had brought their Missouri intelligence with them to the Golden State, exclaimed, 'Well! In so much that my cattle have found a better place for themselves than I had provided for them, they know more than I do. Forthwith I will arise from Sweeney Creek and pitch my tent on Ulatis Creek.' He returned to Sweeney Creek and without further delay brought all his belongings to the new home of his cattle.

"Withstanding all those incidents, Mr. Hawkins was a very capable man. He again made temporary preparations for his stock and family where he very soon bought a very large farm. He established a brick yard on his place, made his own bricks and built a large brick house for his family residence, with a great many other improvements besides large barns and sheds which he had the pleasure of enjoying for many years."

According to family lore, Arculus not only signed on as a wagon train scout and made a trip to California in 1849, he also, after having settled in California in 1852, made more than one trip back to Missouri to bring additional herds of cattle across the plains.

A strong earthquake rocked the Vacaville area in 1892 and, although his brick home was not damaged, Mr. Hawkins prudently had the house torn down and rebuilt of redwood. His last survivor to live in his home was Nettie Hawkins Patten (daughter of Duff Green Hawkins) who died in 1976. The house then remained vacant and burned in 1980. The area of the residence and outbuildings is now the site of the A. C. Hawkins public park and the old oak tree mentioned by Mrs. Bunting is still standing.

A. C. Hawkins dealt largely in hides and tallow. He also leased large tracts of land in Colusa County for the harvesting of grain. In 1874 he was listed in local newspapers as "one of those men and companies that were assessed at over \$10,000 for tax purposes.

He was one of the charter members of the Christian Church in Vacaville which was organized in 1855. In 1869 he was elected as one of the directors of the Vaca Valley Railroad Company which was to connect Vaca Station (later renamed Elmira) to Vacaville. He deeded eight acres of his land for the establishment of a public cemetery, now known as the Vacaville-Elmira Cemetery, where he was laid to rest upon his death - July 8, 1895.

Newspaper clipping: "Death of an Old Resident. Mrs. Cornelia C. Hawkins Quietly Passes Away. Was in Her Ninety-fifth Year and Had Resided in This Vicinity Since 1852." Vacaville, Solano County, California. Vacaville Reporter, August 22, 1904.

In the death of Mrs. Cornelia C. (Lamme) Hawkins, a woman of great age and strong character has passed away.

Mrs. Hawkins was born in Warren County, Missouri, March 1, 1810, and died at the old family home near Vacaville, August 23, 1904 at the advanced age of 94 years and 5 months.

She came across the plains with her husband and children in 1852. In the fall of that year Mr. Hawkins came to this vicinity, bought several hundred acres of the Vaca grant, and settled down for life on his new possessions, his home being two miles east of Vacaville. He was born in Orange County, Virginia, May 30, 1808. His father moved to Lexington, Kentucky and thence to Missouri. From that state, he came to California fifty-two years ago.

Arculus Cobler Hawkins was a man of rugged nature, keen in business matters, a strong friend, given to hospitality and firm in his religious beliefs.

In 1854 he and his wife became charter members of the Christian Church of Vacaville township, and he helped to erect on his own land the first house of worship. This building stood on what is now the south end of H. F. Jewett's land, the spot being included within the limits of his grove. Later, at Mr. Hawkins' own expense, the building was removed to the town of Vacaville, to the site still occupied by the Christian Church.

Mr. Hawkins' devotion to the church was shared by his wife, and throughout her life her Bible was her greatest treasure. She was the last of the charter members of the church. Mrs. Hawkins was frugal, industrious, kind-hearted, enduring patiently the trials of the pioneer days and always a devoted mother.

Her active days practically closed some eight years ago, when she was stricken with blindness, and with the infirmities of age, but she had far outlived the allotted age of mankind before she showed signs of physical decay.

Her funeral took place at her old home (now the residence of her son Duff) where she had lived so long, her sons J. Creth and Duff G. and their families and a large assembly of friends being present. The services were conducted by her pastor, Rev. J. E. Denton, and her neighbor, Rev. H. F. Jewett, and her body was laid to rest in the Vacaville Cemetery by the side of her husband, who in early years gave the land for the purposes of a cemetery.

They were both pioneers worthy of remembrance. They were among the brave men and women who faced the perils of the plains that they might take possession of a great state and transform it from a Mexican to an American commonwealth.

Newspaper clipping: "An Old Resident Passes Away. End of an Eventful Life - A Liberal Man and a True Friend." Vacaville, Solano County, California, Vacaville Reporter, July 13, 1985.

With the death of Arculus C. Hawkins at the ripe old age of 87 years, Solano County loses one of its most prominent citizens, and one identified with the growth and development of the state. Like many of the early settlers of this county, he was a native of Virginia. At an early age his parents moved to Kentucky. His early manhood found him a resident of Missouri. In the latter state he farmed and dealt extensively in cattle. At the outbreak of the gold fever he had already amassed a considerable fortune. He soon determined to leave for the Pacific Coast and in the latter part of 1851, he journeyed across the plains, arriving in California in 1852. Differing from many others he at once sought a location to engage in farming and cattle raising, and for this purpose bought an extensive tract in what was then Vacaville township, and a portion of which was cut off and is now in Elmira township. Here up to the time of his death he engaged in farming, at times cultivating large tracts in Colusa county.

He was a man who always took a great interest in religious education and a large portion of the fortune he had amassed was spent in aiding churches and kindred institutions.

At one time he became heavily involved by reason of extensive endorsements for friends, and was obliged to pay in one transaction \$53,000 for friends he had trusted. Mr. Hawkins paid every cent of his obligations, though it took him some years to repair his shattered fortune.

He was a man of phenomenal physique and many stories are current of his power as a wrestler and a runner. An anecdote will illustrate his character. While running a threshing outfit, at a time when he was between sixty and seventy, he bantered any of his men to wrestle him for his harvest wages, if he lost agreeing to pay double, and if he won he was to pay nothing. The challenge was quickly taken up by a sturdy Irishman named Mike. It took but a minute for the Irishman to find that Uncle Arculus was a better man. The defeated wrestler worked the season through, but when the old gentleman was paying off, did not go to the house for his money. Mr. Hawkins sent for him and offered his summer's wages. "Sor," said Mike, "I lost fairly and I claim nothing." "Oh, Mike," said Mr. Hawkins, "it is easy for a Missourian to out wrestle an Irishman. Here is your money." and it was paid.

Mr. Hawkins leaves a widow, two sons, Creath and Duff Hawkins, a brother Col. Sames Hawkins of Alameda one of the best known democratic politicians, and several grandchildren. The funeral took place Tuesday from the Christian Church.

On land that was formerly owned by Hawkins is now found: The Vacaville-Elmira Cemetery, Vaca Valley Hospital, Vacaville Commons, the Vacaville Civic Center Complex, Vacaville Fire Station #2 and Hawkins Park, as well as many residences.

Querries and Comments

1. Any information on the parents of Arculus Cobler Hawkins would be greatly appreciated. Was he the son of the Arculus who is mentioned in the 1789 will of William Hawkins? Or was he the son of Reuben Hawkins (See HH Issue 27, April 1996)?
2. Of A. C. Hawkins' four children that lived to adulthood, I have no record of Jacob Creath after his parents' deaths. The Historical Atlas Map of Solano County shows him as a property owner in 1878. My father (Robert Boone Hawkins Sr.) remembers meeting his son, Chet or Chess, in the 1920's and described him as a tall man who lived in Marysville, CA. Also, after my parents were married (1935) they were invited to Chet's son's wedding in Sacramento but were unable to attend.
4. Jacob Creth, as his name is spelled in the family bible, was undoubtedly named after Jacob Creath, an early minister in the Disciples of Christ (Christian Church) in Kentucky.
5. Catharine Waul Hawkins - perhaps her middle name was phonetically misspelled and was taken from Elizabeth Wall, wife of William Hawkins - see HH Issue 27, April 96, pg. 5.
6. Mrs. James Bunting is unknown to me. She lists Granville Hawkins as coming across the plains with his parents. The family bible lists him as dying in 1838.
7. In the "births" section of the family bible there is a note that reads: "Disappeared on Green River during an Indian attack while crossing the plains in 1852. Party camped about a week and searched in vain for child." It is unclear if this refers to Chapel Carstarphen Hawkins who died June 10, 1852.

HAWKINS LINES

I find that our various Hawkins families used the same or similar first names for their children. There were so many with the same name that it is difficult to identify and set up family groups.

I am going to try to give more information on some of these Hawkinses, so that it may be possible to make some connections. First here is a brief summary of what we find in various references to Williams. I have Williams in my Hawkins line. My grandfather was a William.

Milly Farmer in her book lists some Williams she has found. In the book, Forks of the Elkhorn, a joking reference is made as to the number of Billys in early Kentucky. Milly claims her ancestor was a William. Some of the Williams she has mentioned will be summarized here.

First we find references to some of that Plymouth sea Captains' families. There was a William Hawkins in each generation of that line, it seems. Sir John Hawkins' father was Capt. William Hawkins, and Sir John had a brother, William. Many Hawkins families claim one of this family as an ancestor. Capt. William Hawkins died at Plymouth, England in 1589. Some of his sons, or grandsons, may have been early immigrants to Virginia.

One early immigrant to Virginia was William Hawkins, who was at James City in 1637. There was also a William Hawkins, early immigrant to Barbados, at about the same time. In the early land grants, Theodore Mayes lists William Hawkins as a person he had transported to the colonies, for which he was granted a headright. This was in 1637—probably the William at James City.

Edward Claypoole, an Indiana genealogist who researched Hawkins families, states that he thinks the earliest Hawkins families in Virginia had either a John, William, or a Benjamin as the immigrant ancestor. There are many traditions of Hawkins brothers coming to the New World.

A William immigrated to the Providence plantations in 1638. His line has been researched and many family lineages found in the New England states are reported as descended from him.

Some of the early Hawkins families in Maryland had Williams among their family members.

One of the earliest Williams I find in Virginia was William Hawkins, who had a will dated 24 March, 1654/55, recorded 25 June, 1655. He named his wife, Sarah, leaving the whole estate to her. At her decease, the estate was to go to Argoll Blackstone, (who may have been his son-in-law). He gave a heifer to John Wright.

Another William Hawkins immigrated to Va. in 1652, along with his parents and brothers, John and Thomas. This family settled on the James River.

Reginald Smith has reported an early Virginia immigrant as William Hawkins, with a wife, Martha, first in King William Co., Va. and then in Lunenburg Co. This William may be the ancestor of that Hawkins line written up in the book by Delores MacDonald, and the ancestor of Joshua Hawkins who married Sarah Cook, and who moved to South Carolina, and died there in 1801. Joshua's will, dated 16 March, 1801, has been reported in Milly Farmer's work. Someone has said that John Hawkins (wife reported to be Mary Long) had a brother, William. Is this that William?

However we have a William Hawkins (wife, Mary) noted about 1737 in Spotsylvania Co., Va. Many claim that he was a son of John and Mary (Long) Hawkins. Was he, or did he connect with these early Hawkins immigrants? Then there is a William Hawkins with a will in Orange Co., Va.,

dated 1776, probably the same William. This family has been researched and reported on in the Farmer book.

Benjamin Hawkins of Botetourt Co., Va. (one who married Martha Borden) named his oldest son William, and Virkus reports that his father was a William. Which William?

Orange Co. was a large county, which was established from part of Spotsylvania Co., and perhaps one of the Williams we find in that area was a descendant of some of these earlier Williams.

Now I find a William Hawkins who had a will in Frederick Co., Va. in 1782. You will remember that Frederick Co. was established from the western part of Orange Co. This William Hawkins will names his wife, Jane, and sons—Abel, Asa (Amos?), Moses, John, Richard, and William. A researcher with whom I corresponded has this family as her ancestor, and has done a lot of research on them. She says the DAR records claim this William was a son of Thomas Hawkins, who had a will in Frederick Co., Va. in 1759. (The will is not now available), but the DAR record goes ahead and says Thomas had a wife, Mary, and sons—Thomas, William (born 1717, married Jane Sharpe), Joseph who married Sarah Ann Edwards, Andrew born 1723, and John born 1725. Thomas Hawkins is noted on the rent rolls for Frederick Co., Va. in 1746, for 359 acres.

John Hawkins, son of William and Jane (Sharpe), joined the Revolutionary Army at age 16, and has been listed as a Rev. War soldier. He married Frances Thorpe on 1 Jan., 1782. He died in Hart Co., Ky. in 1831. He had ten children—William, Coleman, Frances, Andrew, James, Samuel, Mary, Washington, Lucy, and John, Jr. Some of these children were living in Hart Co., Ky. in 1850., Andrew, James, Samuel, John and Coleman are shown in Hart Co., in the 1850 census. Some of the grandchildren moved to Miller Co., Mo.

A William Hawkins referred to by Milly Farmer in her list—the one in Campbell Co., Va. in 1800, and the one who had sons, James, Littleberry, and Benjamin is one that is difficult to connect anywhere. Milly also has the reference to William and his wife, Mary, with will in Campbell Co., 1793, which is the same Hawkins line.

This William Hawkins line is mentioned in the book by Ackerly, Our Kin, which states that William Hawkins bought land in Bedford Co., Va. in 1781. He moved to Campbell Co., Va. and died there in 1793. His will in Campbell Co., Va. names wife, Mary, children—William, Littleberry, Robert, Joseph, Benjamin, James and Mildred Hicks. Some of these children are named in marriages in Bedford and Campbell Co.

William Hawkins and Nancy Littenfield, step-dt. of James Shearer, married Dec. 29, 1791, surety Richard W. Hicks.

Littleberry Hawkins and Jane Shearer, dt. of James Shearer, June 18, 1796

Richard Hicks and Mildred Hawkins, Jan. 27, 1790

All above in Campbell Co., Va.

Benjamin Hawkins and Polly Hewitt, April 28, 1804, Wm. Hawkins, surety.

Joseph Hawkins and Nancy Giles, March 25, 1799, consent of John Giles

Moses Hawkins and Betsey Baker, Nov. 13, 1804

James Hawkins and Mary Ann Rather, June 2, 1828

These were in Bedford Co., Va. (Some of these marriages are listed with Quaker marriages.)

(Also remember that there were other Hawkins families in this same general area, and it is possible some of these marriages are not for the William whose family we are researching here.)

Ackerly also takes up Robert Hawkins, who died in Bedford Co., Va. on July 14, 1820. He married in 1794 Nancy Fourquaran, and their children are listed. He may be the son of William, and of course he might be the older Robert noted in the tax lists.

There was an older Robert Hawkins mentioned in 1787 in Campbell Co., who was not tithable (probably due to age), and I thought perhaps he might have been a brother of William? In this tax list William is listed with only one son 16 years old and older. Were the other sons younger than 16?

Another William Hawkins of Essex Co., Va., a son of John Hawkins, and a grandson of Thomas Hawkins, the early immigrant who lived in Rappahannock Co., Va., and who was a burgess, has been researched by several. I will briefly summarize what I have on his ancestry and his family.

Thomas Hawkins was a prominent planter in the old Rappahannock Co. He had many land entries, transported several persons for headrights, and is referred to many times in records of that county. He is reported to have married Mary Lucas, probably in England, and her father, Thomas Lucas, stated he transported Thomas Hawkins to Va. Both Thomas Lucas and Thomas Hawkins were burgesses. Thomas Hawkins had a will dated 8 Feb., 1675, and probated in 1677. At that date he was married to Frances _____ (perhaps Bloomfield?) Mary is not shown in deeds with him after 1664.

The will mentions wife, Frances, and children, Elizabeth, Thomas, Jr., John and Hannah. Hannah married Col. William Moseley, and their children were William, John, and Martha Moseley. The younger son, John, who was a minor at the time of his father's death, married a sister of Hannah's husband--Elizabeth Moseley. The son, Thomas Hawkins, Jr. seems to have died without children in the late 1600's. John inherited most of the estate.

John Hawkins died in St. Anne's Parish, Essex Co., Va. in 1725-26, leaving a will, in which he named his wife, and children--Thomas, William, Mary and Elizabeth. The children were from his marriage to Elizabeth. His second wife was Grace Stollard. She was the one mentioned in the will and was the executor of his will. The son Thomas, Jr. married Ann Covington, and died in 1739. This family was detailed in Milly Farmer's book, information from Mrs. Dorothy Hawkins.

The son, William was a blacksmith, and a minor at the time of his father's death. He married Margaret (Perhaps Connor?) He died in 1769, leaving these children-- Elizabeth Moseley Hawkins, Sabrinah Boutwell, Margaret, John, Thomas, Levin, Burkenhead, and William. Wills of some of these sons appeared in the Hawkins Heritage at one time.

William's sister, Elizabeth Hawkins, married Joseph Reynolds. The other sister, Mary Hawkins, married John Boutwell.

One William Hawkins married Ann (Nancy) Hogg, a daughter of Peter Hogg on Feb. 22, 1787 in Orange Co. Her mother gave consent. Peter Hogg was one of the prominent early attorneys in Va. William and Ann settled in Augusta Co., Va.

Was this William, the one mentioned as a "hatter" in Augusta Co.? Or was that an earlier William? And the one who was delinquent on his taxes in 1773?

We have a William Hawkins, referred to as a Rev. soldier. This William born in Rochbridge Co, Va. June 30, 1764. He applied for a pension, and lived in Mason Co., W. Va. in 1833. He is mentioned in 1840 as living in the home of Nancy Hawkins, aged 76. Could he be the William who married Ann Hogg? I wondered if the William who married Ann Hogg could be William, son of Benjamin and Martha (Borden) Hawkins, but I have nothing to prove that.

There are more Williams in later generations of Hawkins families, but I have no information to connect them to the early Hawkins immigrants.

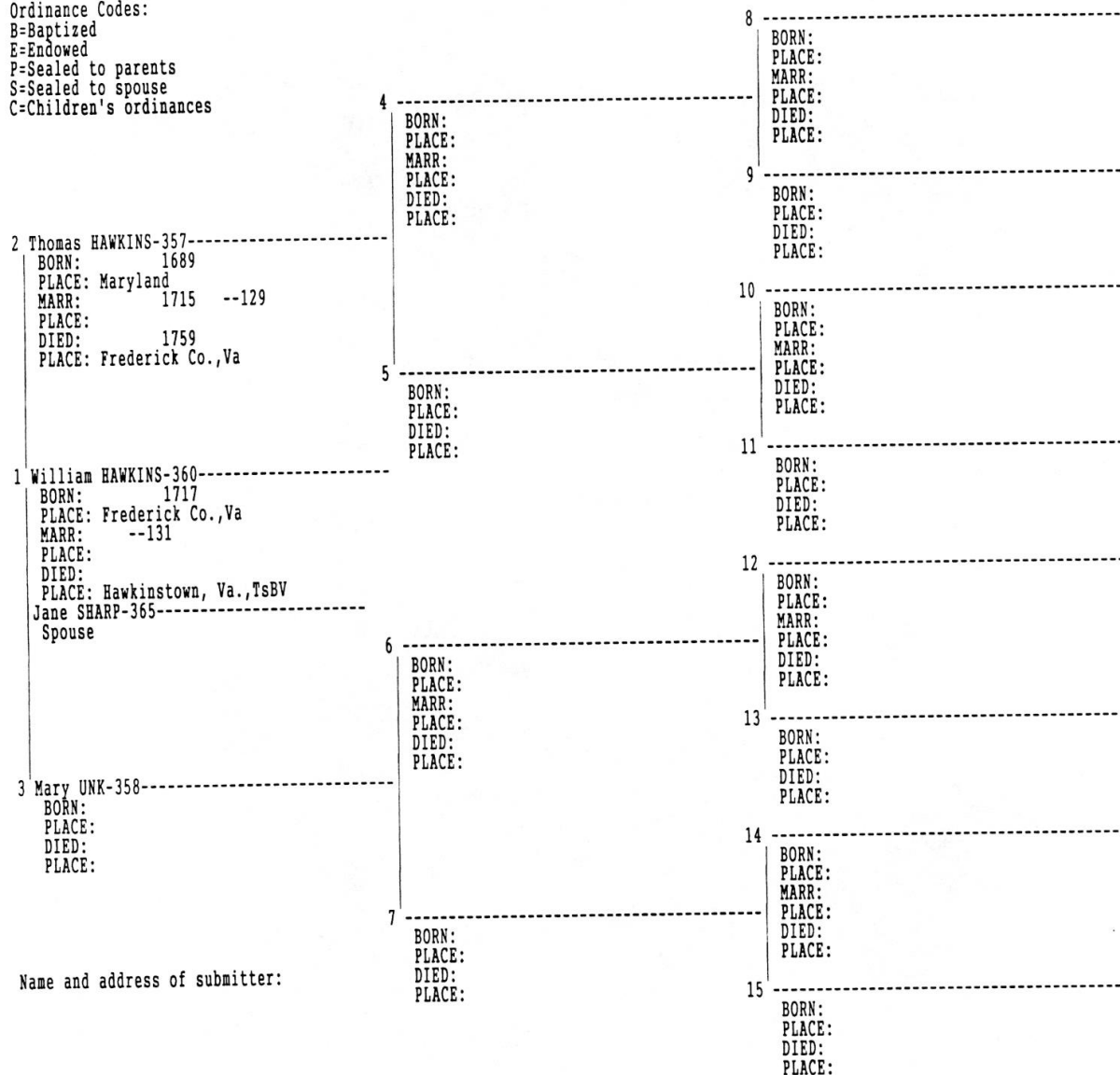

9. If you send family group sheets, number each sheet in the order that it is to be interpreted. This is extremely important especially if it is used in our publication, but also for my indexed files.
10. Put your name on *every* page you send.
11. Please put the date on your letters as well as on the material you submit. It is helpful if you use an inside address on your letters. I file your letters but not the envelopes in my notebooks.
12. If you are a new member, it is hoped that you will send a family group sheet or pedigree chart.
