<u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. The purposes are: To promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. All members are encouraged to contribute letters and material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not covenient, please share it anyway.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the <u>April</u> issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the <u>current</u> year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August, December, and April from then on.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. CYNTHIA HAWKINS SPEARMAN (1851-1943) by Peggy Smith Hake

Sometimes when I walk down the road of vesterday, I encounter some of the most remarkable people. One of the more extraordinary ladies I have found in my many hours of research was Cynthia Frances Hawkins Spearman. Cynthia was born in Miller County in March 1851, a daughter of Fresley and Sarepta (McCubbin) Hawkins. Her birthplace was near the present town of Brumley in southern Glaize township. Cynthia was a product of a fine, old Virginia family where, for generations, her ancestors lived. Her great grandfather was John Hawkins (1759-1831), a Revolutionary War soldier who married Frances Thorpe (1782-1837) for whom Cynthia was named. They once lived in Hampshire County, Virginia, now West Virginia, but moved westward into the new state of Kentucky as many other pioneering families did in the early 19th century. On July 9. 1967, a tombstone for her great grandfather, John Hawkins, was unveiled at Three Forks Bacon Creek Church near Elizabetown. Kentucky by the Van Meter Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Cynthia's grandparents were Coleman Hawkins, son of John and Frances, and his wife, Sarah Martha Bond. Coleman was born in Virginia in 1786 and died in Hart County, Kentucky, near Hammondsville, in 1863. Martha was born in 1782 and died in 1839.

Cvnthia's father, Presley Hawkins, was born in Virginia in 1819. He came to Miller County circa 1842 from Hart County, Kentucky. He and his wife, the former Serepta Ballard McCubbin (1822-1874), married in Miller County on June 15, 1843, the marriage performed by Rev. William C. McCubbin. They became parents of several children including: James Martin Hawkins 1851-1934; Mary Catherine Hawkins born 1849; Cynthia Frances Hawkins 1851-1943; Dr. Zachariah W. Hawkins 1856-1878; William Lewis Hawkins 1858-1930; and Millard Fillmore Hawkins born 1859.

Fresley Hawkins died in 1859 and left his young widow with six children to rear. Evidently some of these children left Miller County, after the Civil War and went to Texas, because Serepta Hawkins died near Waco. Texas in 1874 and is bunied near the town of Bosqueville.

Cynthia lived in Texas during the years her mother was alive. but she returned to Missouri after 1880. In 1885, she married Zebedee Spearman, a, widower with four children. Zebedee's first wife; was Mary Gardner of the Iberia community who was born in Bargen County, Kentucky in 1835. The children of Zebedee and Mary were Gilbert S. Spearman, Alzona Spearman.

Laura Alice Spearman, and Willard S. Spearman. Zebedee was a son of Thomas W. and Nancy (Shelton) Spearman, natives of South Carolina.

Zebedee served in the Civil War in the Union army. He was a 2nd Lt. in Capt. Martin's Company E. Osage Co. Regiment. Missouri Home Guards. He was in this regiment between 1862-1864 and was stationed at Iberia most of the time. The Spearman homestead was about 4 miles west of Iberia. Cynthia and Zebedee had no children of their own. but she remained close to her stepchildren after his death in 1897. He was buried at the Spearman/Rankin Wright cemetery in southern Richwoods township beside his first wife, Mary (Gardner) Spearman.

Cynthia Hawkins Spearman was a schoolteacher in the early schools of Miller County. She studied and attended school until she was 16 and, at that time, felt she was ready to teach. Her first school was a subscription school, the only type in the area at the time. A group of parents would get together and decide to hire a teacher and they would then pay her to teach their children. She taught for over 40 years and helped many children down a successful path in life.

What made Cynthia any different from the other women who taught Miller County's children in the 19th century?.... At an early age, she lost both her lower arms in a cane mill accident. The year was about 1861 and her mother, a widow, was operating the cane mill on her farm. The men had volunteered togo to war as the Civil War was beginning to rage across the countryside. The women were left home alone to manage the best they could with the farm work. The day the accident happened, Cynthia decided she could help her mother....the mill was running and no one was feeding the stalks into the wooden rollers. By nature, and being an inquisitive child, she started feeding stalks into the mill, but something else attracted her attention and suddenly, her arms were in the rollers...Her mother was able to get her arms out of the machine, but they were crushed and mangled. Doctors in the area were not plentiful and it took two days before a doctor could be summoned. Dr. Nixdorf was the first to arrive and then another one came along. They had an immediate problem....there was no saw which could be used for amoutation. A carpenter nearby had a small saw and it used to amputate her arms!

Cynthia was the first woman elected to a public office in Miller County. During 1875 and 1876, she served the county as Supertindent of the Public Schools. Her Hawkins family were prominent in politics. Her brother, James Yawkins, was a state representative, 'a county court judge, and collector. Her nephew, Charles R. "Ted" Hawkins was state representative for

many years. She was also related to Alvin P. Hawkins. a former Governor of Texas.

In March 1940, approximately 250 former pupils and family pathered at the Brumley high school and honored 'Miss Cynthia' on her 89th birthday. She told them about the changes she had seen in her lifetime. She told how she traveled to Texas in a covered wagon when she was a young girl....later she traveled by train and automobile...sailed on a ship while in California...and finally had flown in an airplane on a trip back from California. She also related incidents while teaching school. She said, "Sometimes it was necessary to whip in those days" and many of her former students agreed that she could use a hickory switch just as well as a person who had both hands!

Miss Cynthia died in Miller County on July 14, 1943 and was buried in Hawkins cemetery which is located in the same community where she was born 92 years earlier.

QUERY

Walter W. Hawkins

Does anyone have information on Walter W. Hawkins, listed on the 1850 census of Bath CO KY? Walter was 70-years-old, a shoemaker born in VA. His wife was Elizabeth, 56, born in NC.

Next household: George W. Hawkins, 35, blacksmith, born in KY. His wife, Sarah, was 32. Children listed were Sarah, age 10; William, 8; James, 6; and Elizabeth age 3.

Note: This is a long shot in research, but it occurred to me that the above Walter W. Hawkins might have been a brother to my ggg gf James Hawkins, b1765 in VA. Walter R. Hawkins, was son of James Hawkins, and also had children named George, William, and James. William W.'s age, Bath Co, as well as VA as birth state, would all be appropriate.--Olyve.

HAWKINS FAMILY OF MARYLAND

John Hawkins and wife, Mary. John died 1676, leaving will in Anne Arundel Co. Named children—Joseph Hawkins, Anne Hawkins (married Charles Gorsuch, 1690), Mathew Hawkins, and Thomas Hawkins.

(This is found in Barnes and in Baltimore Co., Md. Wills, by Baldwin ,etc.)
One reference claims the John Hawkins who married second Rebecca Emison Cobb, as a son of this Joseph Hawkins, son of John and Mary.(Barnes does not show him that way.)

Joseph Hawkins, son of John and Mary, died and left will in 1726. Wife's name not known. Children --the John Hawkins who married Rebecca, Augustine underage in 1726, Ruth who married Josephus Murray, Jemina, Sarah married Morgan Murray, and Elizabeth.

Thomas Hawkins, son of John and Mary, married Elizabeth Giles, died 1715. Children named in will (underage at time of will) Aron born 1706, Joseph born 1708, and Ruth born 1713/4.

Mathew Hawkins, son of John and Mary, died 1705.. Wives were Parrish sisters, first Ann Parrish and second Mary Parrish. Children named in will—Mathew, Augustine, Mary married Thomas Noland, Dinah married as second wife to John Cole, Sr., Ann, and Rebecca.

In a family history, "The Parrish Family", which I find at the Decatur Genealogical Library, compiled and published by Scott Lee Boyd, Santa Barbara, Calif. in 1935, and reprinted in 1988 by a granddaughter of Mr. Boyd, the Edward Parrish family is outlined. Edward Parrish was a Quaker, who died in Anne Arundel Co.,Md., in 1723 and had a will, probated in that county. His wife was Mary Roberts, who died in 1750. They had seven children, which included Ann and Mary who married Mathew Hawkins.

From the Parrish book, Mathew Hawkins died in 1705, and his will was probated in Baltimore Co, Md., 24 April, 1705, Bk. 1, p. 138. He left the government of his children to his brothers--Thomas and Joseph Hawkins. His children, by first and second marriages, not known which belongs to which wife, were: Mathew Hawkins, Jr., Ann Hawkins, who married Thomas Broad, Mary married Thomas Noland, Dinah (Diana) married after 1705 to John Cole, Sr., Augustus, and Rebecca. Mary, Dinah, Ann, and Rebecca were not married at the time of their father's death and will. They were left a tract of land "Better Success", 250 acres by their father, of which, 90 acres were deeded to Joseph Hawkins, and the remainder deeded by these daughters and their husbands to Launcelot Todd of Baltimore Co. (ref. IL.S. No. G, page 209, 23 Sept. 1723) (Note--It has been stated that Rebecca Hawkins was not married at the time of this deed, but died soon after. See Barnes' reference to this family. The Parrish book does not refer to Rebecca further.

On page 337 of the book on the Parrish family, the writer takes up the family of John and Dinah (Hawkins) Cole, and states their children were Charles, Joseph, and Mathew Cole. John Cole had first married Johanna Garrett and had these children—Thomas, Sarah, John, Jr., Elizabeth, Dennis, William, and Samuel. Cole. I find no mention of a Ruth Cole in this family history.

It is hoped the query information may be helpful to you. Many members who submitted the queries several year ago have found their answers; however, this information may still put you in contact with someone sharing your line. -- Olyve

April 1987:

Isaac and Sarah Hawkins. Seeking information on Isaac Hawkins b1793, KY and wife Sarah T. Sarah possibly d1860. Children Levi and Minerva Hawkins. Minerva b1839, m. my gr gr gf William Thomas Berry, 2 mar 1854 in Bath CO KY. They moved to IL in the 1860s. Please contact: Mrs. Dolores Berry Blase, 691 Pleasant Ridge Road, Fairview Heights, IL 62208.

April 1988:

Francis Coleman Hawkins. Would like the birthdate, place, and parents of Francis Coleman Hawkins, b. ca1790, probably in VA. Happy to share any information. Jack Moore, R12 Box 378, New Braunfels, Texas 78132-1602.

August 1988:

Samuel, Joseph, and Benjamin Hawkins. Does anyone have information concerning the Hawkins brothers, possibly Samuel, Joseph, and Benjamin? They reportedly came to Gloucester CO VA in 1685. Joseph, who drowned in 1770, perhaps descended from one of the above Wanita Lucas, 100 W. 4th, Pana, IL 62557.

Luther Hawkins - #1? - #2 Lydia Bradock. Seek information: Ancestors and siblings of my gr gf, Luther Hawkins b. ca1812 in MA. Married ca 1830 - 1st wife's name unknown. 2 sons: George b1831; Luther b1833. 2nd wife was Lydia Bradock/Brodock b1817, NY state. There were 8 children: Elizabeth, b. 24-7-1840; Wm., b. 31-7-1842; Melinda, b 23-4-1844; Emma, b 31-5-1847; Charles, b 17-4-1850; Albert, b. 1-12-1851; Mary, b. 1-3-1854; Ellen, b. 21-4-1857. This family was in the 1840 census, living in Pendleton, Niagara CO NY, on 1850 census in Vienna, Oneida CO NY; and 1860 census

of Royalton, Niagara CO NY Willis D. Hawkins, 5412 Bethany Way, Lakeland, FL 33809. 813-858-8811.

Elizabeth Hawkins m. 1774 (?) to Enoch Davis, Sr., b. Feb 14, 1740, in/near Philadelphia. Enoch d. in Wash. CO IN in 1837. At least one son, Enoch, Jr. m. in Grainger CO TN in 1798, and then lived in Guilford CO NC before moving to Salem, IN.

A will of Arnult Hawkins d1862 in Chowan CO NC, listed heirs, Mrs. Jane Bell, Robert, and Elizabeth. Elizabeth Hawkins Davis had at least 3 children, Elias, Abner, and Enoch, Jr. had 10 children, 2 of whom were named Jane and Robert, and also an Elias. Four years ago, in the VSL in Richmond, I found an index with many familiar names in it. The bad news was the book for which it was an index had been destroyed. Judith H. Dixon, Tony Stump, and I descend from the Withers family of Stafford CO. Since my (and other members') James and Margaret Hawkins lived in Stafford CO from at least as early as 1791 until 1825, please notice if you have notations on any Hawkins at all who connect with these surnames listed above? There were early Hawkins in Stafford, but there is also a time lapse before James Hawkins showed up in my Stafford CO research. I would like to connect James to the earlier Stafford CO Hawkins families Olyve H. Abbott, 3737 Summercrest Drive., Fort. Worth, TX 76109.

Are You Trying To Locate An Unknown Maiden Name?

DEEDS: In the lower left-hand corner of most deeds you will find signatures of two to four witnesses. The first one is always from the husband's side. The next one is always from the wife's side. This is to protect her 1/3rd dower right under the law. Nothing you ever use will give greater clues to maiden names than witnesses to old deeds.

MORTGAGES: In the 1800's and before, it was traditional when the daughter got married, as part of her dowry for the father, to either cover the loan or carry the note for his son-in-law. If you know the husband's name but not the wife's maiden name, find out to whom they are making their mortgage payment. About 70% of the time it will be her father.

Thomas Faulconer and Related Tidewater Virginia Families

by
James G. Faulconer and Tommy L. West
(Published by Gateway Press, 1994, Baltimore, MD)

This book was mentioned in an earlier issue, but I will give some more information about it. Hawkins pages are from 74 - 102. This section begins with Captain Thomas Hawkins, in the house of burgesses in 1632, in Rappahannock. His legatees were wife Francis and sons, Thomas and John. Some surnames included with this Hawkins connection are Hinchman, Rouzee, Vawter, Lucas, Blomfield, Stallard, Reynolds, Boutwell, Covington, Faulconer, and Moseley (much information on this family.)

Captain Thomas Hawkins II (Thomas I, III, and IV were included) married a second wife named Mary. Faulconer mentions that one deed allows her maiden name -- "Deed of gift by Mr, John Binchman to my daughter Mary Hawkins " Approximate dates are from the early 1600's through that century.

Mr. Faulconer lists titles of publications from which he found his information. He also included information of the Ralphe Hawkins line. His will was proved in 1626 in the Archdeaconry Court of Canterbury, England. Descendants apparently first lived in York CO VA.
