- <u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.
- NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not covenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.
- QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.
- MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began HAWKINS HERITAGE with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the <u>current</u> year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

<u>PEDIGREE SERVICE</u>: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. HAWKINS HERITAGE QUERIES

This is a continuation of queries published in our past issues. They are duplications for those who have subscribed for several years, but I hope it is convenient to have queries compiled for review; and may be helpful to new subscribers. (Some addresses may no longer be accurate.)

April, 1994:

Hawkins - Johnson

The Honorable Joseph Hawkins and his wife, Cornelia, lived in Texas when their son, Tellitus Tellemicus was born on 7-April-1859. Family tradition has it that Joseph was a judge. Tellitus was a deputy sheriff or ranger, and died from wounds from a bank robbery in 1930 in Galveston, TX and was buried in Kyle. He was married to Louisa Cruz. They had a son, Thomas Martin Hawkins, born 22-March-1889, born in Wimberly, TX. After Louisa died, Tellitus was married three additional times, to Hallie Richmond McNeill, Maude L. Lee, and Agnus Leon.

Tellitus and Louisa's son, Thomas, was married on 5-Nov-1917 to Mary Frances Reynolds in Fort Collins, CO. She was daughter of William F. Reynolds and Ettie Isadore Roberts, and was born 29-Nov-1900 in Chicago, and died 19-Nov-1925 in Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands. Does anyone have further information on this family, and on the ancestry of Judge Joseph Hawkins and his wife, Cornelia Johnson?

Hawkins - Halliday/Holliday

Sally Ann Hawkins, daughter of James Hawkins, married George Halliday, on March 3, 1835 in Fleming CO KY. Evidence shows that James is the same James Hawkins who was born cal765 and lived in Stafford CO VA from 1791 to 1826,

at which time he and his wife, Margaret, and their family moved to Clark CO KY. During that period in Stafford CO, there were also three Hallidays shown on the taxation records. Hawkins - Moody - Hedges - Kissick

Jane Hawkins, daughter of James and Margaret Hawkins, was born ca 1810 in VA, and married James H. Moody 28-July-1830 in Fleming CO KY. They had at least one child, Joseph Harvey Moody, b. 12-8-1840, d 30-6-1898 in Farmers, Rowan CO KY. Joseph married Ivelia Jane Hedges in Maysville, KY on 26-12-1861.

Walter Scott Moody, b 4-9-1835 in Bath CO KY, d 27-1-18?6 in Lewis CO KY, married Margaret Ann Hedges, daughter of Jesse Hedges and Lucy Ann Hawkins, daughter of James Hawkins. They had at least Cora; Mary Jane, b. 23-1-1865; Lucy, b 1868 (d. single); and Mota Francis, b. 16-9-1870. Any information appreciated -- Olyve.

Hawkins - Springs - Scott - Wiess - Roamell

Seeking information on **Dr. J.W. Hawkins** from IL. Married first ??? and had a daughter, **Margaret E.**, born Nov. 20, 1860 in IL. Moved to Guadalupe County, Sequin, TX, and married **Mary Elizabeth Springs**, March 25, 1872. They had a son, **William Ashbury** (or Asbury) b. July 7, 1872, who m. **Cynthia L. Scott**, May 8, 1901. A daughter, **Lizzie**, was b. in 1874 and m. **Thomas C. Wiess**, Oct. 10, 1897.

The first daughter, Margaret, m. Solomon M. Roamell Oct. 16, 1880. Dr. J. W. Hawkins d. between 1874 and early 1880. Mary Hawkins d. November 23, 1911.

Williamson Hawkins - Rebecca Littleton

August, 1994:

Can anyone provide information, either speculative or proof, regarding **Joseph Hawkins** who married **Annetke Jane Edwards** about 1739, and moved to North Carolina?

Background for this query: There are various reports that seem to connect a **Joseph Hawkins** who settled in the Shenandoah Valley as early as 1740, with a Quakeress, **Annetka Jane Edwards**, as wife. In the will of **Joseph Hawkins**, recorded in Frederick CO VA in 1770, his wife was clearly Sarah. we do not know any details of Joseph or Sarah's lives before they moved to this frontier area new Woodstock, VA.

There are good reasons why the family record of **Joseph Hawkins and Annetke**, as retold by Zella Armstrong in her writings as inaccurate. It may be that there are two Joseph Hawkins who are confused with one another, but lived about the same time period.

It seems to me that it might be helpful to try to see if there was another Joseph who married Annetke in 1739, and what happened to him. . . . Wanita Lucas, 100 West Fourth, Pana, IL 62557.

John Westley/Wesley Hawkins Rebecca Best

Also known as "J.W.," was born ca 1817/18 in Rowan CO NC. He married Rebecca A. Best about 1827/28 East Tennessee. In 1850 John and Rebecca were in Andrew CO, MO (near St. Joseph.) In 1857 they were in Chase CO KS (Clements.) They moved to KS about 1857 with four children. They had two children while in Chase CO. (Parents and four children on 1857 KS Territorial Census.) Their children were William Riley, b1849 MO; Isaac Richard b1850 MO; Susan Frances (my gr grandmother) b1852 Andrew CO MO and married John Thomas Patton in 1870 in Chase CO KS; Rebecca Jane b1854 MO; Prince Lafayette "Fayette" b1857 Chase CO KS; John Henry b1860 KS.

John Westley Hawkins served in Northern Army in Civil War. He d1864 of pneumonia at a regimental hospital in AR. I believe he was buried near Ft. Smith, AR. I have a burial for a John W. but the company and regiment numbers and names do not match up. My Hawkins family were some of the first settlers in Chase CO KS. Some still remain there. Is anyone working on the same or related lines? The children of John W. and Rebecca Hawkins are in KS and OK and maybe TX and CA. I will share information Margaret E. Haynes, P.O. Nordyke

I have been working on the Quaker family called NORDYKE that started in NJ and either trekked through the Southern States or went directly to Southwest Ohio by 1825. Afterwards, the various Nordyke groups not in Ohio went on to the plains states: Westward. They went in a round-about manner from VA to GA to the Carolinas to TN, KY, to OH. They would leave a daughter here or there, but by the Civil War, that name was gone from the South. Only a few served in the Union armies and none in the Southern forces. If there is any direct or indirect relationship with any of the members of Hawkins Heritage, I would like to share information. Thank you very much for looking. I hope to hear from you.

Hawkins - Freyschlaf

I am trying to find information on Lucy HAWKINS
Freyschlaf, 1828-1922. I believe her to be the granddaughter of Benjamin Hawkins, the Indian Agent. Lucy is
buried in the evergreen Cemetery in Fayetteville. She is
listed in School Days, School Days, History of Education
1830-1950 (Mrs. Edward Freyschlaf.) This was The Female
Seminary which opened in 1839 with fourteen Cherokee girls
of prominent Indian families of wealth. In the LDS
computer, Lucy Freyschlaf, born 1827, Native American, born
Cherokee Nation. In the 1850 Census of Washington CO AR.

Edward Freyschlaf, age 35, born Germany.

Lucy, age 23, born KY

Sophia, age 5, AR

George, age 3, AR

Herman, age 2, AR

I have a few books on Benjamin Hawkins, The Southern Indians and Benjamin Hawkins 1796-1816 by Florette Henri, 1986. On page 317 . . . "Hawkins died in the Creek Agency on June 16, 1816, leaving Lavinia, whom he married before he died, and seven children: Georgia, Muscogee, Cherokee, Carolina, Virginia, Jeffersonia, and son, Madison." Grant and Davis, "Wedding of Col. Benjamin Hawkins," 314-15.

Jeffersonia, in a suit against Hawkins' other heirs in 1834, claimed as the only child born in wedlock, the right to a larger share or the whole of his estate (Georgia Department of Archives and History, Hawkins Papers, Will and Lawsuit); Muscogee may not have been Hawkins' daughter, although brought up with the Hawkins children (Grant, BH, xxi and n.41) C.M. Destler, "Correspondence of David Bridie Mitchell," 382.

Page 317: These were left to **Lavinia** and his children and to his nephew **William Hawkins**, governor of NC - as perhaps **Benjamin** might have been if he had stayed comfortable at home. 51.

Page 358, footnote 51: Hawkins Papers, Estate of **Benjamin Hawkins**, Inventory and Sale, Georgia Dept. of Archives and History.

If **Benjamin Hawkins** listed as a mixed blood descendant in one book, what happened to him in the other book? If Jeffersonia had a legal claim to the estate of Benjamin, why did she wait until 1834? Would that have been when Lavinia died? Was Lavinia Indian or white? If she was white, my Lucy Hawkins is supposed to be Native American!





WHORLS AND FLOURISHES

~ Penmanship ~

My elementary school writing class was far ahead of the quills of yesterday, and just before the ball-point pen. We used fountain pens at home, but were required to use penstaffs in school until the fourth grade. We finally stopped printing and began writing cursive, a word I thought pretty sure was naughty.

Those little circles would most certainly have been better in class if I hadn't held the pen in the awkward way the teacher told us. She reminded us of the four principal movements used in writing: the finger, slide, muscular, and the whole-arm movements. Did other pupils really use that whole-arm thing? The circles I drew sometimes had "squigglies" on them, when the freckled-faced boy behind me kept dunking my ponytail in his inkwell.

A correct position at the desk, and also for holding the pen, is "indispensable to good penmanship. This position naturally gives the muscles a free and easy action best suited for beautiful writing." Remember your teachers telling you?

The Reverand Lewis Elliott, Grandmother Anna Kate Hawkins' teacher, gave her a beautiful penmanship book, Real Pen-Work. Published in 1881, it is full of writing exercises and lavish pen and ink drawings. The drawings were reproduced in the book by a process called "photoelectrographing," at the time referred to as a "new and ingenious electrical process, by which all kinds of writing and penwork can be reproduced on paper in any color."

Several pages of alphabets created a special highlight. Some letters were formed of tree trunks and branches.

Another alphabet pictured a different animal for each letter. The animals were not simply sketched, but drawn in graceful flourishes. In one set, swaying feathers formed

each letter.

Following the book's explicit instructions for real pen-work, one can learn to draw and write an elegant hand. The execution of the whorls and flourishes in pen-drawings of animals, birds, and feathery fans are beautiful. Remember, in expert penmanship, "letters look best when slanted at about fifty-two degrees from the horizontal," and that's a quote from Real Pen-Work.

Writing history homework in bed, while watching television, really sets the above theory back another century.

If you would like to take yourself into an earlier time, try the following: In my great-grandmother's journal, she wrote of making quill pens. The secret was in choosing the correct feather, and her papa said one from a goose or turkey was best. She boiled the feather tip to clean it. When dry, she sliced the tip end upward for about an inch, then cut off the top part. Scraping the insides formed a neat little hollow. She used a sharp penknife to shape the tip. She cautioned to make a thin cut up the tip to hold the ink. Slice it blunt or fine, at your own choosing.

I've never tried this myself, but the next time a turkey wanders into our yard . . . $\,$

This is the family history of Willis R. Hawkins and his descendants. Willis was a young father who volunteered for the Confederate army in the first days of the Civil War and who served throughout that conflict. He fought in many of the battles on the Virginia front, was captured at least twice by Federal troops and was wounded more than once. He returned home to Gaston County, N.C. a few months before the surrender at Appamattox so that he could be treated in the army hospital in Charlotte. Just a few weeks after the war ceased, Willis died as a result of his battle injuries.

Willis wrote many letters to his wife, Mary Jane Sanders Hawkins, while he was away in the army. These letters have been preserved and copies are included in <u>One Hawkins Family</u>. He left two young sons, Miles Hill Hawkins and Joseph Thomas Hawkins. Miles settled in Rutherford County, N.C. and later moved to Greenville, S.C. Joe remained in Gaston County for the remainder of his life. This book follows the story of this these two lines down to the present time.
