- <u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.
- NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not covenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.
- <u>QUERIES</u>: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.
- MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began HAWKINS HERITAGE with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

FAMILY BIBLE

In 1985, a friend and I went "antiquing" in Fort Worth. In one of our favorite haunts, we found a Hawkins Bible, dated 1825. The main surnames in the Family Record are: Pearce, Wood, Shepherd, Gage, Merzig, Monson and Hawkins. On separate sheets of paper, a more complete record of Hawkins names are listed. They were tucked inside the Bible's pages. In this issue I am using a copy of the original pages. I wouldn't know how this Bible found its way from Burlington, NY to Texas, but it did.

About the time we found the Bible, I noticed the name of a gentleman in the LDS records. He lived in southern California who and was researching Uriah Hawkins – the same Uriah listed in these pages. Since my friend, and not I, purchased the Bible, I mailed the Californian photocopies of the Bible records. Needless to say, he was thrilled because he desperately needed the record of names he did not have. Now that's a neat little story! Since that was years ago, perhaps one of our subscribers connects with this Hawkins family as well. These two pages follow.

Interesting Historical Notes

From the History of Old Rappahannock County, Virginia, 1656-1692, by Thomas Warner.

John Hawkins, son of Major Thomas Hawkins, burgee from Rappahannock CO in 1676, had only four months to serve. John, an orphan, was bound by his mother, over to his stepfather contingent upon his receiving a liberal education. John did not know of this. Had there been the slightest disgrace associated with his being bound out, neither his mother nor the court would have allowed such an arrangement. By inheritance, John would be a large land holder. Thomas Hawkins died ca1676.

Understandably, John wasn't pleased with the custody arrangement his step-parents made. In February of 1691, he returned to court. "John Hawkins, son of Majr. Tho. Hawkins, this day in open Court made choyce of Capt. Wm. Moseley for his guardian." Moseley was brother-in-law of John Hawkins.


Continuing John's displeasure, he was back in court in September of 1704. "Jury to settle land dispute between Wm. & Frances Robinson and John Hawkins. Frances is the only dayu and heir of Saml Blomfiueld dec'd. Benjamin Moseley swore in the jury. John Hawkins produced an plder patent and was found Not Guilty of Trespass."

(Essex Co. W&D 12, p. 59) It seemed some felt that Frances Blomfield Robinson was Samuel's dau by his second marriage. The dispute shows that Frances Robinson had a claim against the Hawkins estate. Such a claim could have come only frin her mother who was the widow of Maj. Thos. Hawkins (ll), and the 1st wife of Samuel Blomfield. John evidently proved he was the rightful heir.

James Hawkins

1820 Census of Stafford County, VA, showing James Hawkins (born c1765) and males in his family. It seems the three sons would be Moses R, Walter R., and James R. James, the elder, was on the Stafford CO tax records from about 1793. He and his family moved to Clark County in the early 1820s.

James and family moved to Clark County in the early 1820s. His son, William Morton, lived in Clinton CO MO. The other sons and daughters stayed in KY as far as I know. I corresponded with descendants of each of James and Margaret Hawkins' offspring, except for Sally and Margaret. Margaret, born c1813, married David P. Ringo 28-11-1833 in Fleming County. They had descendants living in the Sherman, Texas area, but I've never located them. I found that information on an extensive Ringo Internet website, but never received an answer to my query. Sally married George Halliday in Fleming County in 1835, but I've not furthered research on her family. That's on my "to do" list! The following record is census of Fleming County, 1830. (Thanks to Sally Hathaway for sending it in.)

Walter R. Hawkins

•

Walter R. Hawkins, ancestor of Sally Hathaway, was a blacksmith, according to Fleming County KY's 1850 census records. At this time, Walter was married to Angeline Snedegar/Snediger. As his family continued, he named male children after each of his brothers. While we do not have a record of a Thomas R. (note below) being the name of one of Walter's brothers, it is entirely possible and he may have died young.

Walter's brother, Moses R., was also a blacksmith. Later in life, he owned an Inn in Hillsboro, KY, a two-story establishment serving spirits (ghosts perhaps?) and offering a night's lodging for travelers who waited to board the train. The Inn also served as a depot.

Will of John Hawkins, 16 Feb. 1725/6 Essex

To my son Thomas Hawkins 700 acres that he is now possess'd with and laid off by John Vawters.

To the said Thomas Hawkins one Negro fellow named Sam in lieu of all his estate both real and personal.

To my son William all the rest of my land I now live on excepting 200 acres that is to be lent to his mother in law at this plas.

Unto the said William Hawkins these five Negroes Jack, Nan, Hector, Dick, Frank and Joane after my wife's widowhood.

Unto my daughters Mary Hawkins and Elizabeth Renolds that seat of land called Jacks hills equally divided betwixt them, Mary taking the lower part.

To Elizabeth Renold five Negroes already given to her.

Unto my daughter Mary Hawkins five Negroes Moll, George, Kate, Plimoth and Joe and after my wife's widowhood, Tom.

Unto my son William Hawkins all the land I bought of Larkin Tue.

All the rest of my personal estate equally divided betwixt my two children William and Mary Hawkins and my loving wife.

I will that David Frazer work in the shop and that it be equally divide betwixt my wife and children and that after my son William is of age to have the smith's tools.

My loving wife Grace Hawkins executrix.

Signed John Hawkins. Wit: John Wilson, David Fraser.

The will proved in court on June 21, 1726. The inventory recorded the next month, on July 19, and the estate was valued at :533.12.7. (WB 7, pp. 166-9)

It was noted that John's children had some trouble getting their shares of their father's estate from their stepmother. William Hawkins, one of John's sons went to court, bringing suit against his stepmother. By 1828, he was old enough to represent himself, while the preceding year, his brother Thomas, represented him. Grace Stallard later married John Morgan, her third marriage.
