PURPOSE: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: *HAWKINS HERITAGE* is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not convenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.

QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began *HAWKINS HERITAGE* with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

Hawkins - Newland - Crews

The information I have leads me to believe that **Martha Hawkins Newland** remarried after **Isaac Newland's** death in 1808. She married **David Crews** in 1812 in Madison County, KY. Isaac's brother, **Abraham** was married to **Mary Crews**.

Martha's brother, **John Hawkins**, was named guardian over **Isaac, George, and Silas Newland** when their father died. I later found that Isaac and George moved into Boone County, MO where they both married. . . . Isaac to **Hannah Hicks** and George to **Polly Ann Searcy**, his second wife. . . (his first wife was **Talitha Turner** who was a granddaughter of **Abraham Newland**, his uncle.)

I also found various land transactions for these two brothers and **John Hawkins** in MO. I have a copy of a slave dispersal for the slaves for **Isaac Newland** that verifies that John was the guardian of these brothers. (Silas Newland is the only one who remained in KY.)

I do not know which family moved to Franklin County, TN, but I do know that the Newlands and the Hawkins and a couple of other allied families moved into TN and some into IA. I believe, however, that my line settled in MO. If there is any documentation to the contrary, I would welcome it, because I want my information to be accurate.

I am not aware of **Weeden** or his family (which John Hawkins is Jane referring to?) There were so many John Hawkins, and keeping them straight is my problem. I am interested in the name of Betsy's husband. . . . **John Bright**. One of Abraham Newland's sons was Jacob (Bright?) Newland, and he had twin boys named **Bright** and **Light**. . . very unusual names. I have seen this name of Bright listed as Jacob's middle name, but I have not been able to verify that with his descendants.

Her parents were **Philip Emberry (Embry) Hawkins** and **Amanda Berry**. Phillip was born about 1861. Other children included **Tom, Lee, Jennie, and Phillip**. Phillip was also married to **Lare J. Debbie is researching her husband's line. His grandparents are Arthur Callison and Sarah Hawkins. Here is the information she has on them thus far.

Arthur Callison was born in 1882 in Bolivar, Polk, Missouri. Died 1926 in Muskogee CO, Oklahoma. He is buried in Coleman Cemetery. His mother is Sarah Jane Callison. He remarried after Sally's death.

Sarah Hawkins is born between 1863-1866 in Missouri, and died 1922 in Muskogee CO, Oklahoma. She is supposed to be buried in McClure Cemetery, though she is not listed in the book of the names buried there. She married first to **Ephriam Emery** and had six children.

1. Edward Thomas born 1883 in Missouri, died July 1966 in Porterville, Tulare, California. He married Mattie Mae Long.
2. Joe married Mary
3. John born 1886, died 15 April 1966 Tulare, California. He married Verdie.
4. Welford Allen born 1887 in Missouri, died 1919 in Porum, Muskogee, Oklahoma. He married Ollie Luellen Choate.

I think the other two children are daughters, but I am still trying to get names for them.

Sarah's parents are **Isom/Isam/Isham** Hawkins born in 1838 in Barren CO KY. Died 1907 in Bolivark, Polk, Missouri. He married in 1858, probably Barren CO Kentucky to **Martha Ellen Lollar/Sollar**. She was born 1839 in Missouri.

In checking further records I find that Isom's father is **Jesse**, his father is **Isom**, his father is **Joshua**, his father is **Michael** and his father is **Edward**. Of course, none of this has been proven yet. But I am working on it.

Will of James Hawkins – Died 1801

June 22 1801 Logan Co KY
Will Book A-1 pg. 573

My will and desire is that my estate be disposed of as hereafter directed Viz: To my wife Lucy during her life I give that tract of land on which I now live, also the balance of a tract containing one hundred acres purchased of Samuel Caldwell. I also give to my wife Lucy all the stock and all the furniture both household and kitchen. It is my will and desire that my wife Lucy should have all my negroes during her life or widowhood. Should she marry it is my will that my said wife Lucy should have one third of my aforesaid negroes during her life with full power to emancipate them all at or before her death as the said negroes arrive at the age of thirty-one years. It is my wish and desire that my wife Lucy should emancipate said negroes as above directed. The balance of my estate after paying my debts to be equally divided among my children except my daughter Nancy Walker and the balance of my children as they come of age or marry have as equal division as can conveniently be made to the amount of acct. I have received against my son in law Jacob W. Walker which amount I look upon to be his share. Should there be any thing remaining after said division it is my will and desire that my aforesaid son in law and daughter Nancy jointly come in or an equal share with the rest of my children. As also that part of my estate which I have given to my wife Lucy to be equally divided amongst all my children after her death. I also appoint David Walker & Walter Wyatt my...to this test...will. James Hawkins

Letter from Fanny B. Southgate To General John Hawkins

General John P. Hawkins,

Dear Sir:

Your letter of June 16th reached me in due course of mail. I am very sorry not to be able to give you the information you desire. My knowledge of the Hawkins family being limited to my own branch of it. I ought to be better informed, as I am doubly connected with the family. My Grandfather and Grandmother Butler. My Mother's father and mother were own cousins. My Grandmother Sarah Hawkins Butler, was a daughter of Martin Hawkins who came from Virginia and of whom many remarkable anecdotes are told in the family. One of his riding the sturgeon over the falls of James Rive -- perhaps you have heard.

My Grandfather was Major Thomas Langford Butler son of General Percival Butler and Mildred Hawkins of Carrollton, KY, sister of Martin. I think the father of Martin and Mildred Hawkins was named John and came from Norfolk Virginia, and I am sure that I have heard of some cousins near Georgetown, Ky, for one them William Hawkins, was the first husband of my Grandfather's sister, Jane Butler who was afterwards Mrs. Dr. Ewing of Louisville, KY.

This is absolutely all I know with any degree of certainty. The oldest near relative I have of the Hawkins name is a cousin of my Mothers--Judge Edmund Waller Hawkins of Newport, KY. I think he could tell you more about the family than any one and I you were to write to him I am sure he will take pleasure in doing so.
