- <u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. We want to promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.
- NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. We encourage members to contribute material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not covenient, please share it anyway. Write your name or initials on each page.
- <u>QUERIES</u>: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor. Send enough to cover your questions. Please include siblings whenever possible.
- MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began HAWKINS HERITAGE with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, but we do have some other areas. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus SASE.

Sure, it took days to go through all those books, but I found cemeteries, land grants, marriages, Mason memberships—all helpful in my research. For me, at least, it provided a foundation for the next step of microfilm. Had I known then what I know now, I may have started with the film, but it worked. Did I mention taking a sandwich and candy bar that I gulped down somewhere between noon and 1:00? Behind the stacks of course. Did I also mention I stayed all day?

I need to bring up a refresher reminder here, now that this is the $17^{\rm th}$ year of <code>Hawkins Heritage</code>. When we began this publication, it was with the understanding our members would contribute information for the issues. Otherwise, it's a fulltime job for the editor.

Opal I. Coy, 98, of Morrisonville, died at 1:45 AM Saturday, March 15, 2003 in St. Vincent Memorial Hospital.

She was born July 17, 1904, in Palmer, Illinois, the daughter of Walter and Alice Pugh Hawkins. She married William D. Coy on June 18, 1924 in Taylorville, Illinois. She was a homemaker. She was a 1923 graduate of Morrison-ville High School. She was a member of Morrisonville United Methodist Church, where she taught Sunday School for many years. She also belonged to United Methodist Women, Delta Alpha Class and Morrisonville Historical Society.

Surviving is her daughter, Mary Alice Coy-Moore of Morrisonville. She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, and son, Jerry Coy. Graveside Services will be held at 10:00 AM Friday, March 21, 2003 in Morrisonville Cemetery with Rev. David Glahn officiating. There will be no visitation. Hello Olyve,

I saw your e-mail address on RootsWeb. I have been searching for the father of **William H.Hawkins** b.1829/30 in Woodford County, KY. for several years now. (Soooo many Hawkins with the same names.)

In the 1850 census he was living at home with his mother **Rhoda Hawkins**. She is head of the household, and two of his sisters, **Almeda Hawkins** b. 1839 and **Lucinda Hawkins** b. 1842. I do not know if he had brothers or not. In the household in 1850 with the Hawkins, were two other people, an elderly man by the name of **Barnes** and a lady with the surname of **McDaniel**.

Almeda Hawkins married **Joseph Carter** and Lucinda Hawkins married **Paris Baugh**. Jane Thomas, Almeda, Lucinda are all buried in the Carter/Long/Thomas cemetery near Gratx KY, Owen CO. I have a copy of a picture of William Henry Hawkins and a picture of his father, but I do not have a name to go with the father.

William Henry Hawkins died 1909 in Veechdale, KY at 78 years of age. He was survived by 10 of his 22 children. All his daughters died except one. Most of the girls died before they were five years of age. One Daughter, Lucy, lived on into old age. The children are as follows:

Jordan, Joseph, Robert, Frank, Edward, William, Albert, Lee, Ford, and one daughter Lucy Hawkins Long (My gr gr grandmother.)

He was married 2 times. **Albert, Lee** and **Ford** are sons from his second marriage. He is buried at the cemetery in Simpsonville. (This information from my Shelby Record newspaper.)

My Lucy Hawkins married James Long in Gratx, KY.

On a marriage record to **Jane Thomas**, it states that both his parents were born in VA, and he is from Woodford

CO. On his death certificate it states he is from Anderson CO KY. $\,$

Everyone seemed to like the name William Henry. I feel probably the Hawkinses moved into KY with family. They seemed to be close to the Long and Thomas families in the Owen CO area, and intermarried. I believe William Henry Hawkins' mother married a **Joseph Thomas** after William Henry married **Jane Thomas**.

I am looking for the family of my husband's maternal family.

Samantha Hawkins, born in Indiana about 1870 is the daughter of William and Martha J. (Ray) Hawkins married Edward (Edmund on the marriage license) Hendrix in 1889 at Carmi. Illinois.

Edward took Samantha and his daughters, **Marie** and **Lillie** (our grandmother) to Arkansas. Samantha had three daughters: **Marie**, **Lillie**, and **Zalma**. Zalma was born in 1905 in Arkansas. Samantha died about two weeks after the birth of Zalma.

We do not know if she died in AR or in MO. Edward's mother lived near Arab, MO. Edward might have taken his daughters to his mother's home after the death of Samantha.

William Hawkins was not around when Samantha married Edward. Martha J. Ray Hawkins had married a Joseph Hendrix in 1896. William Hawkins might have died.


I am hoping you've run across this family while researching the name. I have very little to add to the ancestry of Samantha's daughters. I have the descendants of all three girls. Thank you.

Benjamin F. Hawkins - Indian Agent

One source for Benjamin F. Hawkins is in the Bible of Philemon Hawkins of N.C. He is listed as being born $28^{\rm th}$ October 1787 and died the $6^{\rm th}$ of June "at 8 O'clock in the evening 1816."

Those of you who descend from this line possibly already have these records, a copy of which is located in the North Carolina Department of Archives and History. Sheila Parsons posted this copy, although it is not her line.

The reason I am including it in this issue is Benjamin Hawkins is mentioned several times, along with his children, in Janice Woods Windle's 450 page book, True Women, copyrighted 1993 and published by G. B. Putnam's Sons, New York. Written in a fictionalized style, it is based on the facts of Mrs. Windle's ancestry, as they moved from the south to Texas. (The book is available in paperback as well.)

In one instance, nine-year-old Georgia Virginia Lawshe had just been hit in the head with a stone as she walked along a road near her home. She realized that the McGregor family had been driven out of town as they rumbled down the road, their possessions stacked high on the wagon. The McGregors had lived on the Flint River since ". . . the days Georgia's grandfather, Benjamin Hawkins, had been Indian Agent to the Creek Nation."

Georgia was the daughter of Cherokee Lawshe and Cherokee was the daughter of Benjamin Hawkins. Tobe, a slave of Benjamin's, told little Georgia that Benjamin Hawkins was "one of the greatest men who ever breathed." Tobe explained the child's Indian heritage to her and why people drove the McGregors away and had hit her with a stone.

Delia Hawkins, mother of Philemon Hawkins of Pleasant Hill departed this life on the 20th day of August, A.D. 1794 respected and esteemed by all her acquaintances. She was the daughter of Zachariah Martin a respectable planter, and native of Virginia. She was one of the first settlers upon six pounds creek in No. Carolina where her husband Philemon Hawkins owned a mill. The country was then a wilderness, which occassioned corn to be extremely scarce, and when the poorest of the people came with their little corn to the mill, instead of taking toal, she would add to their morcell and have it ground into meal gratis. She was universally kind to the poor, the great ceator of us all blessed her with a great share of health and wealth and she lived to be 73 years of age. Philemon Hawkins father of Philemon Hawkins of Pleasant Hill was

Unfortunately, in the prior copies for patrons' use, a few top lines were cut off, as well as some of the last lines of the pages. This causes the correspondence to be much like anagrams and other word puzzles. For that reason, I have chosen "bits and pieces" from these letters that concern either Hawkins or other surnames that make a connection. Since I have 32 unnumbered pages, you can see the difficulty. Whether it is of value to some of our Hawkins researchers is yet to be learned.

Please keep in mind that this information from one page to the next may not accurately join that next page!

Dear Sir:

You some time ago you received a letter written by me from Louisville, requesting information as to descendants of John Hawkins who deeded lands to several persons aggregating about 500 acres, to which letter you promptly replied imparting the information requested.

I now write to request you to seek the old deeds and get permission to send the original to _____ (torn off.)

Item 1: Is the 600 acres surveyed, for John Hawkins of North Carolina? No. 3 I think was the John Hawkins who married the widow Singleton and he was perhaps the John Hawkins who was member of the $1^{\rm st}$ Ky Legislature; 5 and 6 are probably the John Hawkins of Va I think, and John Hawkins, Jr. I guess was the father of John _?_ Hawkins.

You see the Register has not mentioned the L. O. M. Warrant issued to John Hawkins, Lieut. nor has he given the

most important item of a _____ (Last line is missing from the page.)

I appeal to you to prepare the paper for the Filsom Club to be read at the earliest date you have it ready. You know the meetings are on the first Monday of each month. If it is not convenient to come down, I will gladly volunteer to read it for you, if you will forward it to me.

"... On the 7th of last April M. Green, kindly furnished me the following information of this John Hawkins - viz - "John Hawkins and Sarah his wife of Scott County made a deed about 1796 or 98 to one John Adamson, for 1000 acres of land." witnessed by several Thomases. This John Hawkins had three other 1000 acres tracts of land in the same part of the county - the Western part, next to Brackers (??)

I think he also had 1200 acres in another part of the county. I think there are other deeds from "John Hawkins and wife" on record in your county. All made prior to 1804 at which time he died ______ ed named Fannie (Sorry, but the bottom line is torn. I do know there is a Fannie in General John Parker Hawkins' correspondence.)

I'll add to the confusion with one or two more:

".... My father, Walker Bourne, was born in Culpeper near Raccoon (sp?) May 5th 1790. I would like to know whether there are Bournes or Walkers now in . . ."

"... Please answer this question at once, as a kinsman will be here on Monday 21, and I would like to have

information for him. State whether they show marriages of John Hawkins and Margaret Jameson about 1766 or 1767. Also whether the marriage of John Hhawkins to Sarah Johnson (after death of Margaret) about 1769 to 1775.

"I know that Maj. Gabriel Long was twice married. I would like to know to whom your records show any Gabriel Long was married .

"The Ball marriage from formation of Culpeper up to the time you have given may explain those given by you.

"If the will of the second Robert Green does not show the name of his wife perhaps some deed made by him and his wife somewhere between 1751 and his death may give a name of the wife. If he married in Culpeper it was between formation of County and 1751. If married before that I think it was recorded in Orange. If you know some relative in Orange who understands examining records, please have him examine for marriages in that county from 1734 to formation of Culpeper for marriage of Balls to Green and slaughter."

Note: I added that last paragraph because I know we've had subscribers interested in those two surnames, not that the above helps any. Right now, my eyes can't decipher any more. It just goes to show, a hundred years ago, finding an ancestor had its problems as it does today. ~ OHA

Elisha Hawkins

Greetings to all Hawkins family tree researchers from the Elisha Hawkins descendants. There was more than one Elisah Hawkins of course; ours is the Elisha Hawkins of N.C., VA, and TN, who was born around 1802 in NC and married Isabelle Roberts. There are about two dozen of us related to Elisha with a web site at which we share information on our family and old photos. We have had trouble getting very much information on Elisha's parents and siblings. That is the reason for this query.

I know that Elisha's mother was named Sally, but know nothing more about her. It appears that Elisha had brothers named Thomas Lowery and Caleb but could have had others. Thomas Lowery's death record would suggest that his father was a James Hawkins. I have found a James Hawkins in a census of Wilkes CO NC where Elisha once lived, but have almost no information about him.

A book of Virginia biographies (which includes Thomas, son of Elisha) indicated Elisha's father was a Burton Hawkins. The Burton Hawkinses of Grayson County, Virginia would appear to be a possible father, but not too likely, in view of his youth at the time of Elisha's birth (14 years of age perhaps.) And the name of Burton's wife, whom he married later than 1802, was Ruth, not Sally.

A John Hawkins of Wilkes County, NC, owned land on the same creek as Elisha (not "Stony Fork" John but the other John Hawkins of that county.) I have wondered about his relationship to Elisha, as well as the relationship of other Hawkins families living in the Wilkes area. Our Elisha can be found on a census of Wilkes County in 1830 and 1840; in between those years some of his children were born in Johnson County, Tennessee. By the mid-1800s he was living in Russell County, Virginia.

I am interested in talking with anyone who might have more information on our Elisha Hawkins family. The names of
