- MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: We began HAWKINS HERITAGE with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxation records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they migrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for group research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote.)

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for and single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue: December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; then three issues per year beginning April 1988 to current.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information which we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Olyve, I saw your e-mail on the Hawkins RootsWeb site. I really wish I had known about the newsletter you have been sending out. I have been doing research for about 6 years. If you would please look in your index for a Nathaniel Hawkins married to a Mary Edwards. Nathaniel was born about 1792-94 in VA and died in 1860 in Conway County, AR. He and Mary married, I was told, but never found proof of, in Todd County, KY. However, I do find them on the census there in 1830. Then they show up on the census in Conway County, AR in 1840 with 7 of their 9 children: Elizabeth – 1831; Thomas David – 1835; John Washington – 1838 (this is my line); Margaret – 1839; Nathaniel E. – 1841; Mary – 1843; Albertson- 1845. Next 2 born in AR: Julia Ann – 1850, Martha Jane – 1853. We have hit a wall with Nathaniel. The HAWKINS surname per the 1990 census comprised .059 per cent of the total population, ranking 159th of more than 87,000 names. Smith was the most used surname comprising 1.006 per cent of the population.

The HAWKINS DNA Project is a private venture. No remuneration is received by any of the participants.

The purpose of the HAWKINS Worldwide Genealogy DNA Project is to assist in the confirmation of collected historical data. Participants in the project submit samples from light scrapings/combings from the inside cheeks of their mouth. These combings are tested for the number of "repeats" (or alleles) of selected markers of the Y-chromosome (the y-chromosome is passed from the father to the son each generation, and are unchanged for many generations). The alleles (12, 25, or 37) are entered into a database for comparison to all other participants. Surname participants with the matching markers are descendants of the same male ancestor.

Knowing what proven Hawkins line that you descend from will allow you to concentrate your efforts on that line, not wasting time with an unrelated group of Hawkins; it will help keep you out of that proverbial blind alley. An example is the matching of two lines of brothers from the 1700s, and their subsequent matching to an individual descended from a third unknown brother with a paper trail to the three brothers' grandfather. Joining our project will help all Hawkins in the search for our history.

Kermit Hobson Hawkins (June 5, 1914 – Nov. 8, 1991) Born in Brantley, Alabama. The family called him "Hobson." He was my daddy.

He died in Melbourne, Florida. My half brother Kermit Lee and I barely arrived on time to say goodbye. He passed on later in the night of the only occasion ever when he stayed all day in bed. His third wife, Helen, called her parish priest to pray with him. The last words Daddy ever spoke, ever so sweetly, were, "God bless you too, Father."

Although he lived most of his life away from the South, he never lost his very marked Alabama accent. His last, and very painful illness lasted for many years, but he would not see a doctor, nor did he ever take any medicine. When people were around he would smile and say he felt "jus' fine!" Then he would leave the room to sit on "dee po'ch" and lament, "This ol' worl' and one mo'!" He always had a workbench on "dee po'ch" and there was always a large Bible on the workbench. I can see him now, during those last years: he was 5 foot ten and could not have weighed over 100 pounds. His blue eyes never faded. He had hair like polished silver, catching every ray of light. Florida was too hot for him and so he only dressed in shorts, with no shoes or shirt. He rigged the American flag on a palm tree. At attention, saluting the flag, he was a picture that should have been caught by an artist: the frail old Marine, only in shorts, his back to me, he would raise the flag every morning, and lower it every dusk, and then he played taps on his harmonica.

How does anyone fighting in the Asiatic Pacific during WWII ever return alive? How did daddy return with many ribbons, but no wounds, no tattoos, no salty military words? He would not even tolerate an unkind word about another person. Hobson was markedly a very *Semper Fi* Southern gentleman.

He walked "funny" though. He glided. His head did not bob up and down, not even when he was an old man. Then I remembered! He was in the crack Marine Band in Quantico, VA...all of those marches, drilling, and complicated maneuvers; he could walk no other way than that of a seasoned dancer. He played second coronet. And, I think, any woman he met played second fiddle to his second cornet. A musician since childhood in Phoenix City, AL, going to and from the music academy, he had to hide his music under his shirt in order not to be beat up by the neighborhood bullies who could not understand that a real man could read music.

At home Hobson usually sat outside, even during his many years in Erie, PA. Sometimes during a snowstorm you could find him sitting, with no coat on, in the yard on a bench staring at a fire in the barbeque pit. His passionate patriotism, his pride in our country's history, in the family history, and his love for the South, would somehow snag his visitor into a discussion of at least one of these subjects. He was an easy-going, mild-mannered man, and so it would get a little scary when he spoke with such anger about Andrew Jackson, "the meanest president this country ever had!" Then he would explain, touching on the unspeakable horrors of the Trail of Tears.

Daddy had first entered the Marines on Jan. 13, 1934, and was discharged Jan 12, 1938. He reenlisted on Jan. 13, 1938 and was discharged on Mar. 7, 1941. Because of WWII he reenlisted on April 13, 1944 and was discharged on April 22, 1946. During the war he served in the Asiatic Pacific area.

Between battles and maneuvers he began his career as a sculptor during his stint in the Pacific. With his Marine knife he carved statues out of the hard Pacific wood so that he would have gifts to send home to the family for Christmas.

Ever the Marine, his coffin draped with "Old Glory," he was buried in Melbourne, FL on Veterans' Day in 1991.

Melbourne sculptor Kermit Hawkins dies

Kermit Hobson Hawkins, a nationally known sculptor whose work ranged from G.I. Joe to the rising Christ at Ascension Catholic Church, died of cancer Friday, Nov. 8, at home in Melbourne. He was 77.

Born and raised in Crewshaw County, Ala., Hawkins was a Brevard County resident for 13 years. His interest in art took shape between battles during World War II, when he carved figures from hard South Pacific woods with his Marine knile, family members said.

After two tours of duty, which included the landing on two Jima, Mr. Hawkins joined Marx Toys in 1946 as master model maker. He stayed with "the largest toy maker in the world" until 1975, when it was purchased by Quaker Oats.

Working with a staff of illustrators and designers, Hawkins made the first model of most of the toys the company produced, including G.I. Joe, the Big Wheel tricycle, Disney and Flintstones characters and a complete set of miniature firearms.

Later in his career, Hawkins turned to fiberglass and created large figures, such as ascending Christs for several churches and the Desert Sheik for the Dunes Hotel in Las Vegas. He also invented a special hardening process to protect the fiberglass from weathering.

Hawkins gave carvings to anyone who admired them, family members said. When visiting a daughter in Mexico City, he filled up his car with toys and handed them out to poor Indian children.

He met his wife, Helen Hawkins, in 1950 while teaching sculpture to veterans in Erie, Pa. They married in 1956.

Other survivors include his daughters, Carol Hawkins of San Antonio, Texas, and Janice Vineziano of Largo; son, Kermit Lee Hawkins of Orlando; one brother; five sisters; nine grandchildren; and nine greatgrandchildren.

Calling hours are 5 to 9 p.m. Sunday at Brownlie and Maxwell-Funeral Home in Melbourne, Mass of the Resurrection is 10 a.m. Monday at Ascension Catholic Church, where he was a member.
