The declaration of John Hardin, a resident of the town of _____, in the county of Jefferson, in the State of Alabama setting forth: I am married; my wife's name was Nancy Johnson, to whom I was married at Madison Co. Ala. on the 15 day of August 1812 Mississippi Territory
I am the identical John Hardin, who under that name served in the military service of the United States as a private in Captain James Hamilton's company of the 2nd regiment of Demassee militia volunteers in the war of 1812. That I Volunteered in the said service at Montsville, in the State of Alabama on or about the 1st day of January, A. D. 1813, for the period of Sixty days, and was honorably discharged at Tazettville Tenn., in the State of Demassee on or about the 1st day of April, A. D. 1813 having continued in said service for more than sixty days. I further declare that I am not in receipt of a pension, nor have I made application for a pension at it. 217.

(and also that I have drawn 2 land warrants, the first 40 acres and the 2nd 80 acres. (some "fine" print omitted)

I hereby appoint DANIEL E. GROUX & CO., of Washington, D. C., my attorneys to prosecute this claim in my behalf, with power of substitution and revocation.
