At a Special District Court of the  
United States, before and holden at  
Winnebunk within and for said District  
on the seventh day of August 1882  
hundred and thirty-two before the  
Honorable Osburn Ware Judge of said  
Court.

On this seventh day of August aforesaid, personally  
appeared Benja Evans in open Court before said District Judge  
Benja Evans, a resident of Winnebunk in the County  
of York in said Maine District aged 32 years who  
being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make  
the following declaration in order to obtain the pension made  
by act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832  
That he served as herein stated.

I enlisted for eight months in April 1775 into Capt. Woods  
Company of Benick in Col. Hubbards Regiment, marched  
to Cambridge and served out the full period of my enlistment  
and after the battle of Bunker Hill, were discharged at Roxbury  
the last of November the same year.

The year following I enlisted into Capt. Wells, Company  
of Wells for four months were stationed at Dorchester  
Hills, served out the full period of my engagement  
and we were discharged I think in September or October  
when I returned home, we were engaged in repairing the Bettle  
in Boston Harbour Col. Foreman's Commanded the Regiment  
and went north after my discharge I think I enlisted in April  
I served four months in this Service, this was in the year 1776 - I  
was a substitute for Elisha Smith of Cochrall near Lynn.  
He hereby relinquishes every claim, whatever to a pension or  
annuity, except the present, and declare that his name is not on  
the pension roll of any agency, in any State.

I was born in Somersworth, in the State of New  
Hampshire, in the year 1750 have resided at Benick and  
now reside at Winnebunk in the State of Maine.

I have no record of my age, I served voluntarily in  
Army as above stated - Lieut Greenleaf of Tisbury  
belonged to the same company Sergeant Getton was orderly  
Major Lemuel Parrott belonged to the same Regiment

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to the residence in York County, Maine, of Benjamin Evans, Revolutionary War soldier, whose record was furnished you July 27, 1931.

Benjamin Evans (S. 31014) stated when he applied for pension August 7, 1833, that he was then a resident of Keenebank, Maine, but gave no street or residence number. In January 1833, he was living in Lyman, York County, Maine.

Benjamin Evans was born, as previously stated, in 1750, in Somersworth, New Hampshire. His residence at time of enlistment in 1775, was Berwick, York County, Maine (Massachusetts) and at enlistment in the spring of 1776, had recently removed to Goshall (later called Lyman). The names of no other places of residence were stated.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, name and address of person paid, and, possibly, the date of death of Benjamin Evans, you should apply to the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, citing the following:
