Patience Milliken Prior's son wrote his name John Milligan Prior. Thomas Milligan and his descendants spell the name Milligan. The 1790 United States Census has the name John Milligan. The Pennsylvania Militia Records have the name John Milligan. The Pennsylvania Militia Records have Abraham Stiles. The Greene Co., Pa., Records have both Stiles and Styles.

Cumberland Co., Pa., where John Milliken resided, was first Cumberland Co., until 1789, then Mifflin Co. until 1831. John and his family removed to Greene Co., Pa., while it was Mifflin Co. His father-in-law, Abraham Stiles, resided there also while it was first Cumberland then Mifflin Co. He also removed to Greene Co., Pa. They both died, as did their wives, in Greene Co., Pa. Their wills are recorded at Waynesburg, Pa.
