# ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unfailing loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

\*Marriage in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful marriage. Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service. (Note: Resolution adopted by the twenty-fourth Continental Congress: Descendants of polygamous marriage can not be accepted as members of this Society.)

## ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

The said THOMAS MILLIKEN is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of Spy and Soldier, Continental Line, Pa.

My ancestor's services during the Revolutionary War were as follows:

At the beginning of the Revolution, he with several neighbors walked to Lancaster, Pa., where they joined a company of expert Riflemen, then being made up; a company that became a part of the Second Regiment, Cumberland Co., Pa. and was sent to Cambridge, Mass., where they arrived Aug. 4, 1775, and participated in the latter engagements in the locality under Gen. Lee. He was with Arnold at Quebec, and during the expedition rendered valuable service as a spy. Afterwards he served under Putnam and was attached to Washington's staff.
