Frank W. Taylor Succumbs Sunday To Long Illness

Frank W. Taylor, 75, of Grinnell, died early Sunday morning at a local hospital following an extended illness.

Services are to be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday from the James-Schalinske Funeral Home with the Rev. Chester C. Custer, pastor of the Methodist church, officiating. Interment will be in the Blue Point cemetery.

The son of W. A. and Minnie Reed Taylor, he was born Jan. 9, 1888, at the family home in Washington township near the Blue Point community. On Jan. 7, 1914, at Montezuma, he was united in marriage with Emily Rutherford.

To this union six children were born: William Henry Taylor of Brooklyn, Mrs. Russell (Ferne Adelle) Koger of Grinnell, Mrs. O. L. (Irene Faye) Fleener of Hemet, Calif., Mrs. Eldon (Virginia Emily) Miller of Brooklyn, Virgil Frank Taylor of Brooklyn and Calvin Richard Taylor of Marshalltown.

In addition to his widow and children, he is survived by 13 grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Pearl Martin of Graham, Wash., and Mrs. Clara Ready of Boulder, Colo.

Preceding him in death were his parents; one grandson, Larry Koger in December of 1962; and five brothers and three sisters.

He had farmed in the Blue Point and Malcom communities until his retirement in February of 1962, due to ill health. Since that time he had made his home in Grinnell.
