

Abstracts of records of Richmond Co., NC. Further abstracted from the reports of genealogist Ransom McBride to Baird researchers.

Richmond Co., NC

Will of Charles Robinson, dated 18 Apr. 1801; proved Jan. 1802. Names sons Squire, Arthur, Charles; wife, Kezia; daughters, Kezia McDaniel, Elizabeth Powell, Jemima Baird, Sarah Robinson; Grandsons, Charles Powell, William & John Hill. He gives to William and John Hill three hundred acres of land, the same that was conveyed to him by Thomas Baird and William Rush as well as slaves and money.

Estate Papers of John Hill - Guardian Bond. 14 June 1802. Thomas Baird, Guardian to William and John Hill, minor orphans. Securities Peter Ussery and James Bostick, all of Richmond County.

Estate Papers of John Hill – List of Charges for Schooling. ca. 1802. John and William Hill, sons of the deceased John Hill made out to Thomas Baird, Guardian.

Court Minutes. Jan. 1802. Thomas Baird gave bond in the sum of five hundred pounds as guardian of William and John Hill. Securities Benjamin Powell and Elijah Chairs.

Court Minutes. June 1806. Col. D. Marsh, James Bostick & Robt. Powell named a committee to settle Thomas Baird as guardian of John and William Hill.

Court Minutes. Dec. 1806. Committee to settle with Thomas Baird, guardian to heirs of John Hill.

Court Minutes. March 1807. Committee settles with Thomas Baird, guardian of William and John Hill.

Court Minutes. March 1809. Peter Ussery, Guardian of William and John Hill, gave up his guardianship. Robert Powell appointed guardian of William and John Hill.

Deed: 24 Apr. 1812. John A. Hill, agent for William Hill, both of Robertson Co., TN sells the land willed to them by Charles Robertson (sic). Deed Bk 20, p. 32. This deed reveals that John and William Hill are sons of Jemima Robinson, daughter of Charles and Keziah Robinson of Montgomery/Richmond Cos., NC, and widow of John Hill, who married #2 Thomas Baird.

Estate Records of Charles Robinson. Sept. 1812, Robert Powell, guardian of William and John Hill, received their share of the division of slaves from the estate of Charles Robinson, their grandfather, who died 4 Nov. 1801. William was 20 years old at this time.
