Whereas Hugh White, of Reels County Missouri, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of Register of the Land Office, at St. Louis in the State of Missouri, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Hugh White, according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 31st of April 1820 entitled making further provisions for the sale of public lands, for the South West fractional quarter of Section Number nineteen, of Township forty four, of Range one (East) in the State of Missouri, containing eight acres, and three hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of survey of the said lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Hugh White. Now know ye that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Hugh White, whatsoever native, tenants belonging unto the said Hugh White, and his heirs and assigns forever. In testimony whereof I James Monroe, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington the Twenty fourth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty one, and of the Independence of the United States the forty sixth.
