

In the vicinity of Kazabazua there are three branches of the Pritchard family, the Pritchards, the Kenneys and the Davies.

Andrew Pritchard and Mary Edey of Alcovoe had nine children. Andrew, one their sons married Amy Brook of Aylwin in 1890. At that time they moved to Kazabazua. There they started a general store, a lumber mill and a grist mill, as well as a cheese factory. They were also the first to build a cottage at Danford Lake.

A few years later Judith, Andrew's sister, with her husband, Church Kenney came. Church worked in the general store which was by then owned by his oldest son, Andrew who had bought it when his uncle went into the cattle business. Later, Andrew's son, Bill took over the store, and he and his brother-in-law, Barmen Johnson operated it until the early 1970's; eighty years in the same family.

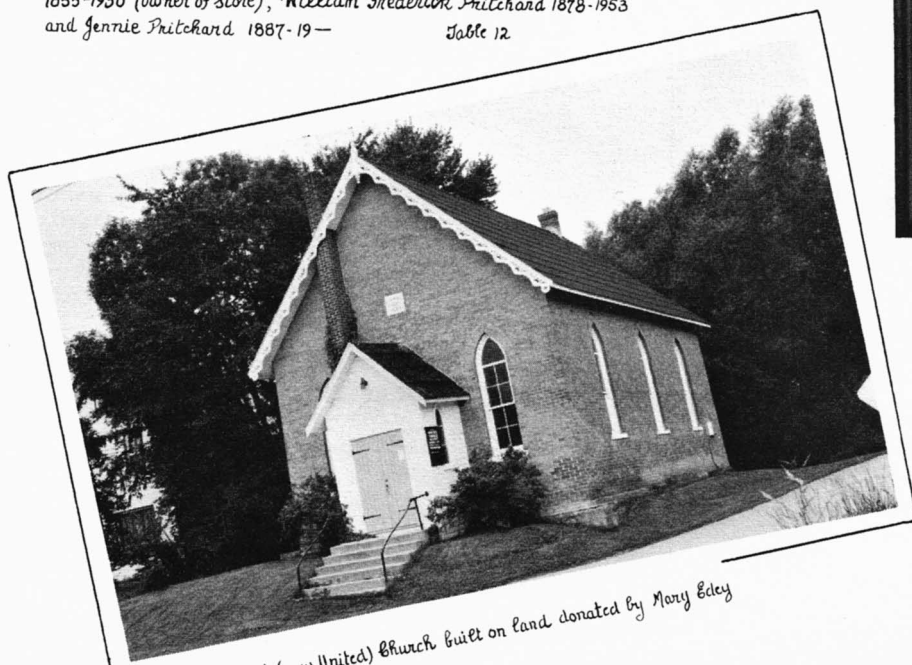
