

### NEW INFORMATION ON JAMES AND JUDITH PRITCHARD

The following are excerpts for a message from James Kenny that provide some new details on James and Judith Pritchard's:

In 1999 I visited Ireland and discovered at the National Library in Dublin that James and Judith Pritchard had been living as tenants on the estate of the Madden Family in the parish of Currin, townland Briscarnagh. This was about the same time that your genealogist was coming to the same conclusion. Incidentally to this I read in a survey description of the parish from the early nineteenth century that both spellings of Currin and Curran were in use with one spelling favoured by one end of the parish (I can dig up this reference if you wish) Anyway (back to my story) a couple of years later I saw a cover of a beautiful manorial house in Ireland on the cover of the English magazine Country Life. In the text I found that it was in the hands of the Madden Family in Co. Monaghan and on further research found that Briscarnagh townland had been a part of that estate until the estate was broken up probably in the 1920s. The estate is known as Hilton Park and since they accept guests and had a website I threw caution to the wind and emailed the Maddens to inquire about the estate papers. He said they were deposited with the Public Records Office in Belfast some years ago. On the net I have found that the Belfast PRO does give the details of that collection. If the Pritchard Family "kitty" can afford it perhaps a Belfast genealogist could be engaged to peruse the estate papers. If I was on the other side of the world I would be pleased to do it myself. I think a professional genealogist/researcher would know how to sort through estate papers, in this case starting at about 1830. These are a valuable source of information and might give more clues about the time of the departure of the Pritchards for Canada and perhaps even the reasons (by reading between the lines).
