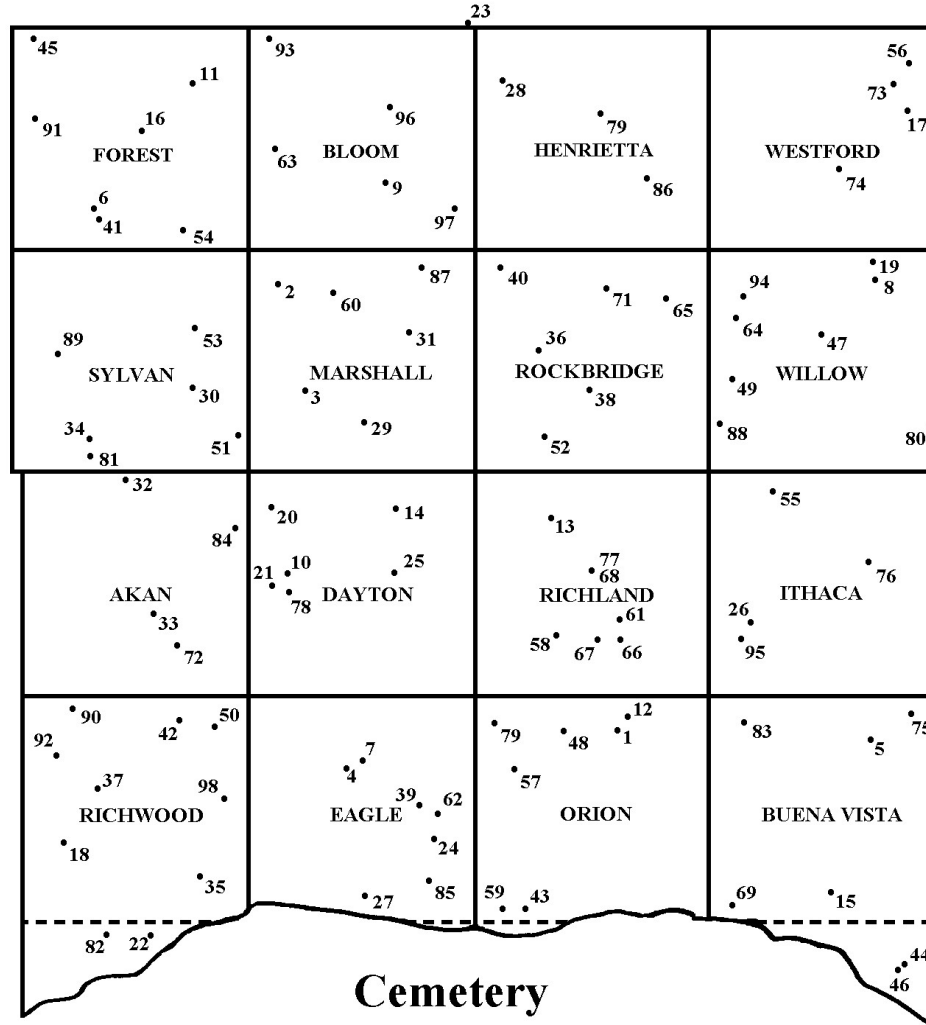

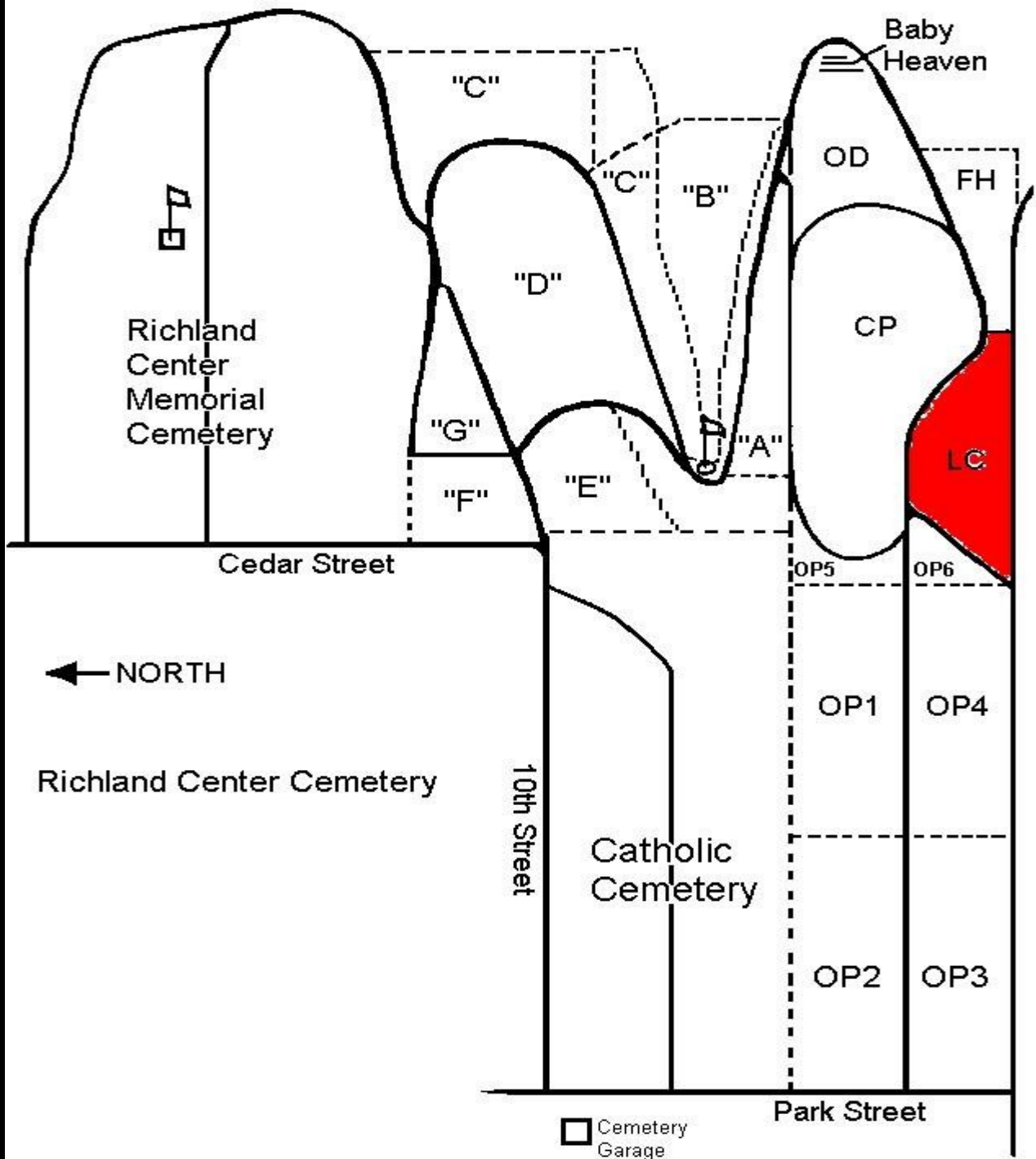

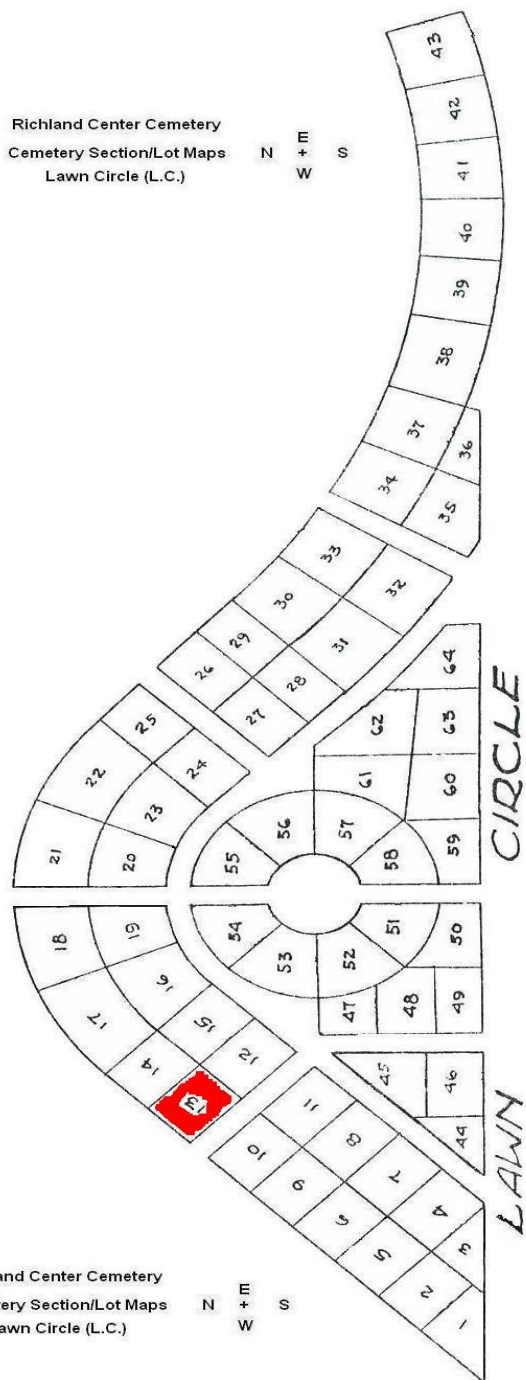

Swimming Pool Accident Causes Boy's Death

Richard Kent Thompson, 12, died at the Richland hospital on Saturday, July 14th at 7 p.m. from injuries received at the swimming pool early in the afternoon. Kent was injured at the small slide; his head having struck the bottom of the pool as he dived off the slide. He continued playing in the pool but soon complained of a headache and given an aspirin. He continued in the pool and again complained of a headache. Taken to a doctor he was transferred to the hospital where he passed away in a short time.

Kent was a student, attended the Gillingham school while his parents resided near there, but of late he has resided in Allison Park just north of the city limits.

The lad was born in Richland Center May 31, 1944. He was well liked by his schoolmates and his untimely death is deplored by one and all.

Surviving are his father, William F. Thompson, of Allison Park, his mother, Mrs. John McBain, of Milwaukee, a brother, David Brent Thompson and his grandfather, Don Briggs, of Richland Center.

Funeral services, with Rev. Kenneth Kohl, pastor of St. John's Lutheran church, were held Tuesday at the Pratt Memorial Chapel and burial made in the city cemetery.

Kent Thompson, 12, Dies From Injury

Kent "Butch" Thompson, 12, died Saturday evening at about 7:00 o'clock at the Richland Hospital from an injury he sustained earlier in the day at Krouskop Park. While it is not definitely known just in what manner he sustained his injury, the doctor's report is that Kent "evidently struck his head on sand bottom after going down slide." He had been swimming at the pool during the day, and the lifeguards at the pool report that the youth came to them complaining of a headache and requested some aspirin.

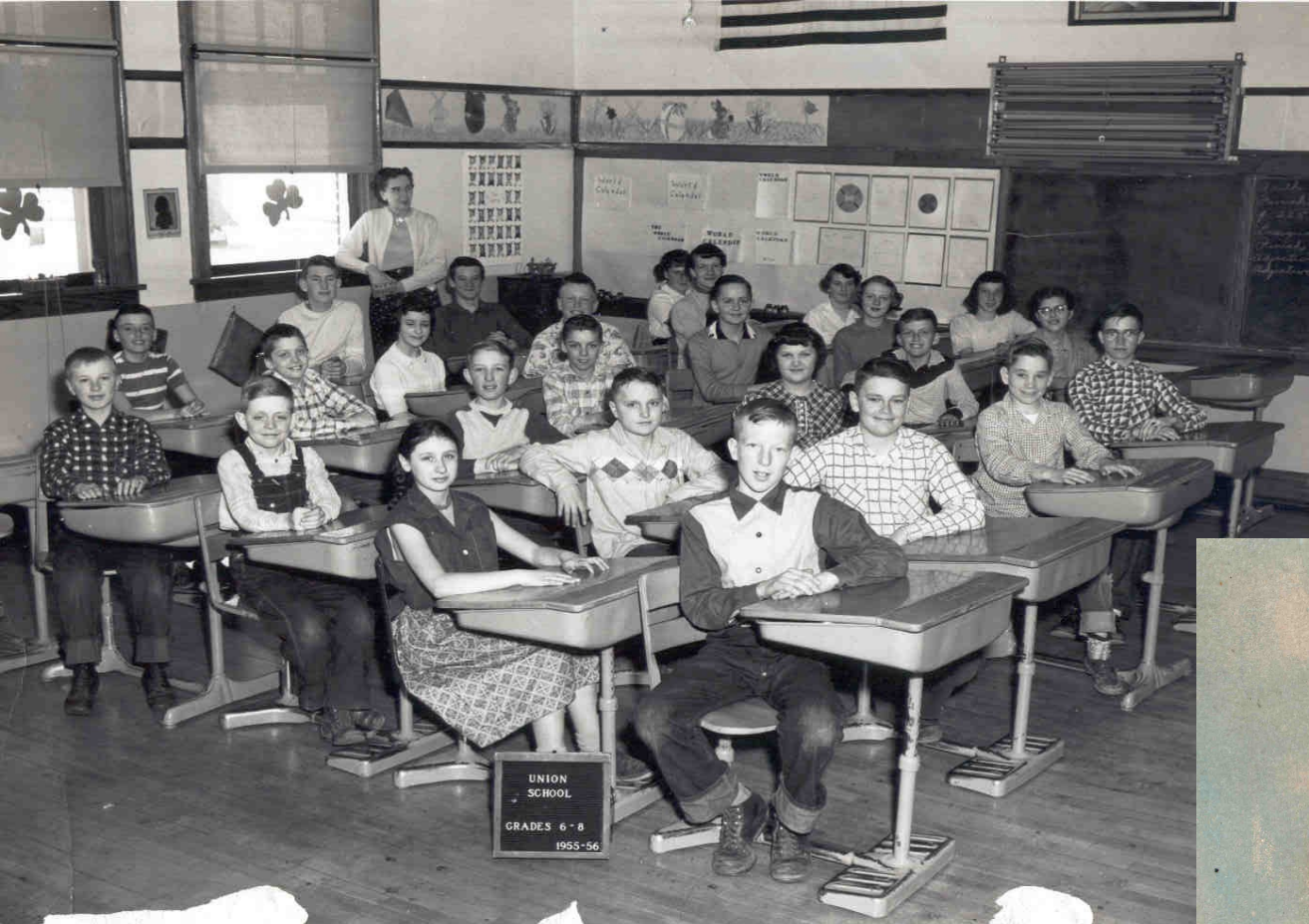
Later, Kent's brother, David, reported to the lifeguards that the boy was still in much pain, and he was then removed to the hospital.

Sunday morning an examination by a pathologist resulted in the following as the cause of death: "Intraventricular hemorrhage due to ruptured branch of basilar artery system due to head and neck injury."

He is survived by his father, William Thompson, Allison Park, with whom he made his home; his mother, Mrs. John McBain, Milwaukee; a brother, David Brent, and his grandfather, Don Briggs, Madison.

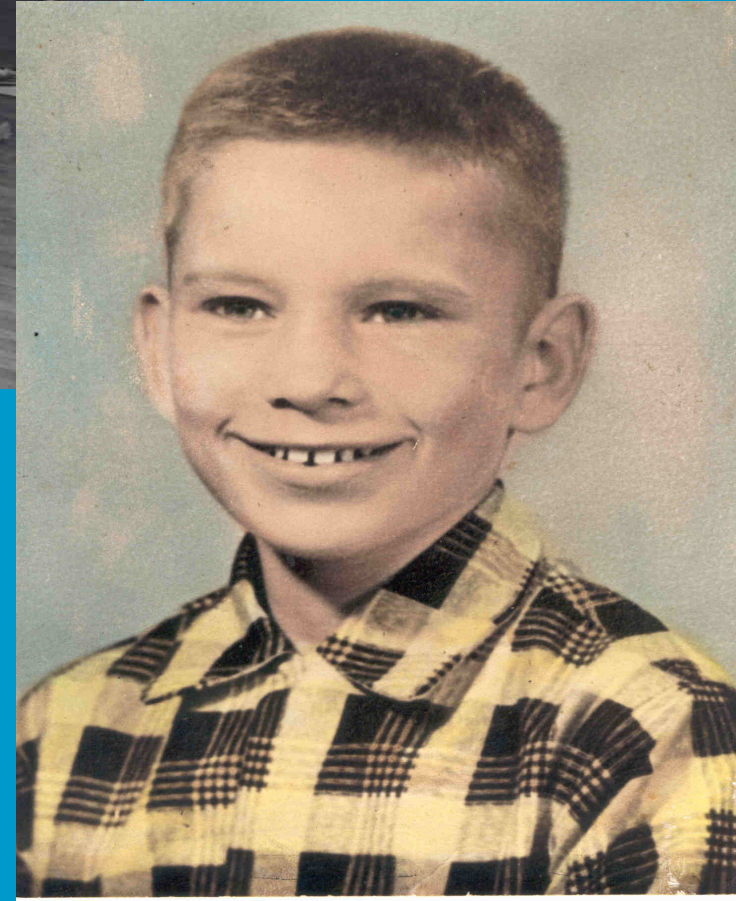

Here Are The Five Paulsons

Richland county now has a second family of five brothers serving their country, the Paulsons of the Excelsior community. The family achieved this honor with the youngest brother, Merlin's induction in February. First family of five was the Staum brothers of Boaz.

A letter from Robert to the Democrat this week tells that he and Roger see each other often. Robert tells of his arrival in Egypt in November, and it is to be presumed they are

now both serving in Africa. Robert is a private first class and Roger a corporal. Both have been overseas a year.

Sgt. Harold Paulson is an airplane mechanic at George Field, Lawrenceville, Ill. Promotion to corporal and sergeant for him have come since November. He has been in service since November, 1941.

Pfc. Donald Paulson is with an ordnance company training near Stockton, Calif.

Fireman Lawrence Cross is home on a 30-day leave, and he reports a thrilling experience on a destroyer. He tells that while on the way to Salerno a torpedo struck the ship, and that as it sank one of its own depth charges exploded, causing quite a loss of life among the crew. He was one of the men saved, but that rescue took place after he had been in the water for many hours, and all of his clothing and personal belongings were lost. The rescued men were taken to Palermo, later to Bizerte and Casablanca, and then a troop ship brought them to New York. All new clothing has been issued, and he will be back in New York by the 23rd to be reassigned.

Marine Private 1/c Wm. F. Tanner of West Mill street, Richland Center, recently completed a special course in the Radio Operators' school, conducted by the Signal Battalion at the Marine Corps Base, San Diego, Calif.

Mrs. Frankie Hole of Sextonville has received several letters from her son Lisle who is now in England. Lisle is an assistant gunner on a Flying Fortress.

Having completed three years of service in the Marine Corps, on Dec. 10th, Paul J. Collins, son of the Leo Collinses, 847 North Church street, now can include himself in the ranks of veteran servicemen. He enlisted in 1940, and finished his boot training Jan. 24, 1941. After a leave at home he shipped out of San Diego for Pearl Harbor March 9, 1941, and served on one ship for 2½ years. Some of his work was very much a secret but he has been able to tell of escorting convoys to the Midway Islands and of witnessing the killing of thousands of gooney birds which are thick on those islands, so that the building of air bases could be begun. About six months ago Collins, who is a coxswain, was transferred to a mine sweeper.
