Catharine Heist); married Christina Fuss on 20/9/1753, daughter of

Nicolaus Fuss. Johanne's father died when he was eight months old

(Johann William) and his mother married Johann Jakob Gaertner.

Johannes left with his cousin Alexander Klinger from Wuertenberg,

Erbach, Germany to Rotterdam, Holland, and Cowes, England, and landed

at Philadelphia, according to Pennsylvania German Pioneers. He

settled near Yellow Springs, now Chester Springs, Pikeland Township,
