

PREBLE COUNTY, OHIO - COMMON PLEAS COURT RECORDS

7-30-1834 - Jemima THATCHER. Satisfactory evidence having been produced to the court that Jemima Thatcher is the widow of Amos Thatcher, late of the County of Preble and State of Ohio; deceased, who was a Private during the Revolutionary War and a Revolutionary Pensioner of the United States under the Act of Congress dated June 7th 1832 and that the said Amos Thatcher died on the 25th day of June A.D. 1834. Ordered that the Clerk of this Court certify the same. (277)

7-30-1834 - Jesse PILES vs. Henry H. Piles and others. Petition for Partition. Partition made as follows: Jesse H. Piles, Henry H. Piles, William Piles, Gross S. Eidson and Jensy his wife, Benjamin Aikman and Rebecca his wife, John Moore and Nancy his wife, each to have 1/8th part; to the children of John Piles, dec'd, to-wit:- Shadrick M. Piles, Jahiel Piles, Joshua Piles, Jeremiah Piles, William C. Piles, Agy Malissa Piles, Sarah Piles, Elizabeth Piles, Baltzer Werts and Nancy his wife, George Wertz and Mary his wife to have 1/8th part collectively; to the heirs of Elizabeth Harris, dec'd, to-wit: Mahala, Rebecca, Jane, Mary and Richard Harris and one other whose name is unknown. 1/8th part collectively. 7-30-1834 - Wm. M. BOYCE a minister of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, granted license to solemnize marriages. (285)

8-1-1834 - Barbara CAILES. Satisfactory evidence having been produced to the Court that Barbara Cailles is the widow of John Cailles, late of the County of Preble and State of Ohio; deceased, who as a Private during the Revolutionary War and a Revolutionary Pensioner of the United States under the Act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832; and also that said John Cailles died on the 25th day of June A.D. 1834. Ordered that the Clerk of this court certify the same. (304)

8-1-1834 - Cornelius O. BANTA aged 18 yrs. on 30th Dec. last past, son of Isaac BANTA, dec'd chose Wm. Curry his guardian. (311)

8-1-1834 - Charles BEAM, a minister of the United Brethren Church granted license to solemnize marriages. (311)

10-13-1834 - John CURRY and Martha Curry widow of James CURRY, dec'd, granted letters of adms. on the estate of James Curry, dec'd. (325)

10-13-1834 - Jane VANDYNE vs. Tunis W. VANCLEVE. Complaint of Bastardy, (328)

10-13-1834 - James BROWN, a native of County Down in Ireland, makes oath of intention to become citizen. (336)

10-15-1834 - Peter HARSHMAN as guardian of Lucinda ZELLERS aged 9 years, 11 months and 6 days, binds said Lucinda to Henry ENOCH until she is 18 yrs. of age. (346)

10-17-1834 - Albert VANWINKLE aged 17 yrs. chose John VANWINKLE as his guardian. (361)

7-30-1834 - David LONGNECKER and Hezekiah LONGNECKER vs. Jacob LONGNECKER, et al. Petition for Partition. Filed 7-15-1833. Land, 121 acres SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 8, Township 7, Range 2. Andrew Longnecker, dec'd, died Oct. 6, 1832. Widow, Elizabeth Longnecker. Children: David Longnecker; Hezekiah Longnecker, Jacob Longnecker of Darke Co., Ohio; Henry Longnecker of Harrison Co., Kentucky; Elizabeth late Longnecker, wife of Noble Keith of Indiana; Susan late Longnecker, wife of Samuel Henderson of Indiana; Mahala late Longnecker, wife of James Weathers of Preble Co.; Eli Longnecker, a minor; and William Longnecker, a minor; of Preble Co. (27)

7-29-1834 - Nancy TAYLOR vs. Salem TAYLOR. Petition for Dower. Filed 10-2-1833. Land, part SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 2, Township 7, Range 1. Ayers Taylor, dec'd, died in 1831. Widow, Nancy Taylor. Son of dec'd: Salem Taylor, a minor. (35)

3-30-1835 - Jesse PILES vs. Henry H. PILES, et al. Petition for Partition. Filed 6-5-1834. Land, 20 acres off West side NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 15, Township 7, Range 3. Jeremiah Piles, dec'd, died April 1834, intestate and leaving no widow at the time of his death. Children: 1/8th part, Henry H. Piles of Indiana; 1/8th part, William Piles of North Carolina; 1/8th part, Jency Eidson late Piles, wife of Gross S. Eidson of Preble Co.; 1/8th part; Rebecca late Piles, wife of Benjamin Aikman of Preble Co.; 1/8th part, Nancy late Piles, wife of John Moore of North Carolina; 1/8th part, John Piles, dec'd, late of Preble Co. who died some years prior to father, his children - Nancy late Piles wife of Baltzer Werts, Mary late Piles wife of George Werts, Shadrick M. Jahiel, Joshua, Jeremiah, William Agy Malissa, Sarah and Elizabeth Piles, the last six being minors; 1/8th part, Elizabeth Harris, dec'd, late of North Carolina who died some years prior to father, her children - Mahala, Rebecca, Jane, Mary and Richard Harris and one child whose name is unknown, the last four being minors. 3-30-1835 - Andrew FERGUSON, et al. vs. Margaret FERGUSON, et al. Petition for Partition. Filed 6-12-1834. Land, In-lots 71 & 17 New Paris and 160 acres SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 22, Township 9, Range 1. Clements Ferguson, dec'd, died in 1832. Widow, Sarah Ferguson, Thomas J. Ferguson, James C. Ferguson, Jane late Ferguson, wife of John F. Ireland, Sarah late Ferguson, wife of James M. Knox, Margaret Ferguson, Clements Ferguson and Mary T. Ferguson; the last three being minors. (61 & 114)

4-1-1835 - Dison DAVIS, et al. vs. Bartly DAVIS, et al. Petition for Partition. Filed 12-18-1833. Land, 100 acres E $\frac{1}{2}$ Section 1, Township 6, Range 2. George Davis, dec'd. Children: 1/7th part, Dison Davis and Elizabeth, his wife; 1/7th part, Moses Davis, dec'd, his children - James, Darius, Melinda, Cynthia and Fanny Davis; 1/7th part, Aaron Davis, dec'd, his children - Daniel, Moses, Aaron, Amos, Luther and Doctor Scott Davis, all minors; 1/7th part, Bartly Davis; 1/7th part, Stephen Davis and Hannah, his wife, of Indiana; 1/7th part, Elizabeth late Davis, wife of James Maxwell; 1/7th part, Rachel late Davis, wife of Bartholomew Davis of Indiana. - 5-1-1850 - Abraham BATES vs. Jacob KESLER, et al. In Chancery. Filed 9-29-1849. Land, 55 acres off west side NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, Township 9, Range 1 and 80 acres east side NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 10, Township 9, Range 1. Peter Kesler, dec'd. Brothers and sisters: Jacob Kesler; Stephen Kesler; Daniel Kesler, dec'd, his unknown heirs; Barbara Boon; Elizabeth Kesler; Susannah Kesler; Nancy Kesler; all of Franklin Co., Virginia; and Samuel Kesler of Putnam Co., Indiana. Abraham Bates had purchased land from Peter Kesler. (450)
- 6-6-1850 - Cornelius VANAUSDAL vs. Jane FLEMING, et al. Land, north end or part of in-lot 156 in Eaton which was mortgaged to Cornelius Vanausdal. Levi Fleming, dec'd, died in 1849. Widow, Jane Fleming. Children: Benjamin N., David, John, James H., William, Jane, Mary and George W. Fleming; the last five being minors. (452)
- 6-12-1850 - William ALLOWAYS vs. William PILES, et al. Petition for Partition. Filed 6-4-1849. Land, lot 46 in Lewisburg. Jeremiah Piles, dec'd, died in 1837 (note: Another place in record states he died in 1830), had resided with son, Jesse. Children: Jesse Piles, dec'd, died in 1844 leaving widow Mary and children—Mary Mahaly late Piles, wife of David G. Freeman, William Piles, Jane Piles, Eliza Piles, John Milton Piles and Joshua Piles, the last five being minors of Preble Co.; Nancy late Piles, wife of Benjamin Aikman; _____ (left blank) late Piles, dec'd, late wife of Baltzer Werts, her unknown heirs; John Piles, dec'd, his unknown heirs; Turner Piles of Preble Co.; Jeremiah Piles; Sarah late Piles, widow of Elias Case; Elizabeth late Piles, wife of David Wertz; Henry Piles, dec'd, of Indiana, his unknown heirs; Jensey late Piles, now Eidson, a widow of Illinois. - 6-13-1850 - James McCABE adms. of George CALE, dec'd, vs. Henrietta CALE, et al. Petition to sell land. Filed 3-13-1846. Land, part of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 26, Township 8, Range 2. Widow Henrietta Cale. Children: John, James, William, Aristus and Freedland Cale. (467)
- 6-13-1850 - Susannah HOUSE vs. Isaac PIERSON, et al. Petition for Dower. Filed 9-25-1849. Land, 77 acres W $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 23, Township 9, Range 2. Michael House, dec'd. Widow, Susannah House. Heirs: Elizabeth late House, wife of Isaac Pierson; Nancy late House, wife of Simeon Huffman; Susan late House, wife of Joel Blankenbaker; Polly late House, wife of Thomas Shelly; Simeon House; Lydia late House, wife of Mancoah Huffman; Milly late House, dec'd, late wife of William Tanner, her children—Michael and Simeon Tanner; Ann late House wife of Simeon Bunker; Julia late House, wife of Ebenezer Shelly; William House; all of Preble Co.; and Joshua House of Owen Co., Kentucky. - 6-15-1850 - James SAMPSON guardian of John C. WHITRIDGE's Heirs vs. William E. WHITRIDGE, et al. Petition to sell land. Filed 6-7-1849. Land, lot 13 in New Paris and 2 acres part of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 29, Township 9, Range 2. Heirs: William E., John C., Ruth J. and Henry C. Whitridge. (477)
