I am seeking all genealogical and biographical details for the family documented below including their ancestors, children, and grandchildren and the spouses thereof, including the full names of those spouses' parents. All additions and corrections within this scope, however speculative, will be greatly appreciated.

Dunne Families of Southwestern Steuben County, New York

I have known for many years that my immigrant O'Keeffe ancestor, Dennis¹ O'Keeffe of West Union, Steuben County, New York was married to Mary Dunne, per the death certificate of their son, Michael², O'Kieff. However, I knew nothing more about Mary's family until the Spring of 2001 when I reviewed the parish registers of St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church of Rexville, West Union in preparation for an ancestral research tour to Ireland. I had examined the parish registers many years prior when I was still teenager with little experience in genealogical research. In 2001, I was delighted to realize that Dennis¹ and Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe had served as baptismal sponsors for the descendants of Daniel¹ and Catherine (Dunne) Coleman and vice versa, indicating that Mary and Catherine were probably sisters. When I asked two great-granddaughters of Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe, Kathryn (Kieff) O'Brien and Mary Elizabeth (Kieff) Lewis, if they are related to the Coleman family, they both confirmed a connection but neither one could state the exact nature of the kinship.

In parish registers of St. Mary's Church, Edward and Mary Ann (McCormick) Dunn served as baptismal sponsors for the family of Ignatius and Ruth (Shaw) Dunn and vice versa, indicating that Edward and Ignatius were probably brothers. I initially speculated that Mary and Catherine were the sisters of Edward and Ignatius but this theory was refuted in October 2002 by additional research. However, Mary Elizabeth (Kieff) Lewis also has a vague awareness of somehow being related to the Dunns so I have continued to document this family in hopes of eventually identifying a common point in their ancestry.

In July 2003, I discovered another probable sister of Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe in the parish records of St. Mary's Cathedral in Ogdensburg, St. Lawrence County, New York. Dennis¹ O'Keeffe immigrated via the port of Ogdensburg on the St. Lawrence River; some of his elder children were baptized there.

I owe a great debt of gratitude to George Sawyer and Judy Allen Cwiklinski who have transcribed many records for Troupsburg, New York and posted them on the Internet.

In Irish O Duinn or O Doinn (doinn is the genitive case of the adjective donn—brown) it is more often written Dunne than Dunn in English. The form O'Doyne, common in the seventeenth century, is now almost obsolete. In fact of

364 births registered for them in a given year, 313 had the final E and only 51 were Dunn. From this it can be estimated that the total number of people so called in Ireland to-day is approximately 15,000, giving them twenty seventh place in the list of commonest surnames in Ireland. This sept originated in Co. Leix (Queen's County) and formed one of the principal families of Leinster, their chief being lords of Ireland in that county. The sept is one of those specially mentioned in the mid sixteenth century official orders as hostile and dangerous to the English interest. It is in that part of the country that Dunes are, appropriately, now to be found in greatest numbers, though they have spread far and wide. Nearly all those who spell the name Dunn came from Ulster. This is a name to which the practice during present century of resuming the discarded prefixes Mac and O does not apply—the form O'Dunn or O'Dunne is seldom if ever seen to-day. (Edward Lysaght, *Irish Families*)

Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe and Catherine (Dunne) Coleman of West Union

1. ___^A DUNNE, otherwise unknown father of Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe, was born, probably in County Cork, Ireland, prior to 1789; he probably died there as well.

The 1840 baptismal record of Ellen (O'Keeffe) Doyle at St. Mary's Cathedral identifies her parents as "*Denis and Margaret [sic] O'Keeffe*" with sponsors Timothy McCarthy and Margaret Dunn. However, Ellen's marriage record identifies her as the daughter of "*Denis Kieff et Maria [Dunn]*." All other sources indicate that Dennis¹ O'Keeffe had but one wife, Mary Dunne, and that she was the mother of Ellen and his other children. Therefore, it appears that Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe's otherwise unknown sister, Margaret, served as a sponsor for Ellen's baptism and that Fr. Bacon wrote *Margaret* in error as the name of Ellen's mother when he should have written *Mary*.

From the records of St. Mary's Church in Rexville, Town of West Union, Steuben County, New York it appears likely that Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe, wife of Dennis¹ O'Keeffe, was a sister to, or otherwise closely related to, Catherine (Dunne) Coleman, wife of Daniel Coleman. "*Dennis Keefe et Maria Dunne*" were sponsors at the baptism of John Coleman at St. Mary's Church, Rexville on NY 6 May 1855, son of "*Daniel Coleman et Catherina Dunne*" (*Liber Baptizatorum 1848-1918*, St. Mary's Church, Rexville, NY [hereinafter *SMLB*]). The Colemans were sponsors at the baptism of Agnes Mahoney in 1873, daughter of Thomas and Bridget (O'Keeffe) Mahoney and granddaughter of Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe. Other Colemans served as baptismal sponsors for other descendants of Dennis and Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe. The O'Keeffe and Coleman households were adjacent to each other on top of Irish Hill, south of Rexville.

Given the difference in Mary's and Catherine's birth years, it is also possible that Catherine was Mary's niece or a relative of some other degree than sister.

Dennis¹ and Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe's son, Michael² O'Kieff, married a native of Sartwell, Annin Township, McKean County, Pennsylvania. Perhaps Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe was related to some of the Dunes of McKean County. The follow excerpt is from *A History of St. Mary's Catholic Church, Sartwell, Annin Township, McKean County; The First 130 Years: 1847-1977* by Joseph A. Plunkett:

Sartwell Parish records supply us with a list of nearly a hundred of its pioneers, in many instances giving the names of wives and children as well. For the sake of brevity we cite here only the names of heads of families and, where possible, the year of their coming to Sartwell...

1845—Murtaugh and Patrick Driscoll, Dennis Driscoll, Jeremiah and James Splain, Cornelius and Michael Doyle and Michael Doyle, Jr.; James Lundrigan;
 1846—Timothy and Joseph Mullin, Michael and John McAuliffe...
 1852—Bernard and Robert McNally, Thomas Dunn (his two nephews were Bishop Thomas and Father James Brennan), Patrick Dunn, Timothy and James Phalin, Thomas Bly...

One wonders if there is any tie of kinship between author Joseph A. Plunkett of St. Mary's Parish in Sartwell, Pennsylvania and Dennis³ Plunkett Dunne (*Edward², Gene¹*), son of Edward² and Mary (McCormick) Dunn of St. Mary's Parish in Rexville.

In the *Index to Griffith's Valuation of Ireland, 1848-1864*, there is an interesting possibility for the common origins of the O'Keeffe, Dunne and Coleman families within the County Cork. Edward Dunne is a rare combination of names in Cork. The only two households so designated in Cork were both in Mogeely Parish, one in the Townland of Knockanarrig and the other in Lyremountain. Patrick Jr., Patrick Sr. and Thomas Coleman were also residents of Lyremountain. Mogeely Parish included other Colemans and numerous Keefes/Keefes including John (3), Michael (3), Maurice, and Timothy.

Dennis Dunne of Greenwood

2. DENNIS DUNNE of Greenwood was born circa 1822 or earlier, based on land purchases made in 1842. If he was identical with Dennis Dunne of Troupsburg as discussed below, he was born circa 1800 or even as early as 1770.

On 3 December 1842, Dennis Dunne of Greenwood purchased 327 acres in Greenwood for \$1,500 from William and Mary B. (___) White of Spring Port, Cayuga County, New York. This property was located within Lots number 3 and 4 (*Steuben County Deeds*, 43:54).

Shortly thereafter, on 31 December 1842, Dennis Dunne of Greenwood purchased 327 acres for \$1,500 from John and Julia (___) Kennedy of Ovid, Seneca County, New York. This property was also located within Lots number 3 and 4 (*Steuben County Deeds*, 43:55). Note that the location, size and purchase price of the property documented in these two transactions are identical. Was there an issue with the previous ownership of one 327-acre plot or did Dennis purchase neighboring plots of equal size and value?

These are the only records found to date that pertain to Dennis Dunne of Greenwood. However, he may well be identical with the Dennis Dunne who resided in the neighboring Town of Troupsburg.

As discussed further below, Gene¹ Dunne of Ireland and Troupsburg was the father of Edward and Ignatius Dunne. From the 1850 Federal Census of Troupsburg, we know that Ignatius Dunn was born about 1820. In 1850, Ignatius' household included a Dennis Dunn who was a Laborer and native of Ireland; he was probably a close kinsman to Ignatius. The microfilm of the original record is very difficult to read and I cannot say with certainty whether Dennis was age 50 or perhaps 80. In either case, Dennis was old enough to have been Ignatius' father yet we know from the 1855 New York State Census that Gene Dunn was Ignatius' father.

Gene¹ Dunne of Troupsburg

3. GENE¹ DUNNE was born in Ireland circa 1775 and died, probably in the Town of Troupsburg, Steuben County, New York after 1855. Gene was married, probably in Ireland, to ___ ___; she married second ___ COLLINS.

Gene was a farmer residing in Troupsburg, Steuben County, New York in 1855 as the "Father" in the household of Ignatius and Ruth M. (Shaw) Dunn. Immediately adjacent to this household was that of Edward and Mary Ann (McCormick) Dunn (*1855 New York State Census*). From the administration of Ignatius Dunn's estate, it is certain that Edward and Ignatius Dunn were brothers, and thus, both sons of Gene Dunn.

In the *1873 Atlas of Steuben County*, the household of Mrs. M.A. Dunn [Mary Ann (McCormick) Dunn] is illustrated in Lot 19 in the Town of Troupsburgh, bordering the Town of West Union. The household of E. Dunne is shown in the next lot to the east, No. 20; a Bishop family lived nearby. From the proximity of the Dunns and Bishops in both 1855 and 1875, it is deduced that the Dunns resided on what is now known as Keegan Road. Keegan Road runs north from the hamlet of Young Hickory to Price School Road, towards a region that was known in 1875 as West Troupsburg. This area is not far from where the town boundaries of Troupsburg, West Union, Greenwood and Jasper meet. Also, Ignatius Thomas³ Dunn (*Edward², Gene¹*) married a Keegan.

Along with the families of Mary (Dunne) O'Keeffe and Catherine (Dunne) Coleman, Edward and Ignatius "Dunne" both appear in the early parish registers of St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church in the neighboring Town of West Union at Rexville.

Although increasing in numbers, no church was established until the year 1845 when Catholics came together and resolved to build a church in which they could worship God... The site of the new Church with attached cemetery in Greenwood [Steuben County, New York] was donated by Patrick Flynn. His memory will always remain dear to the priests and Catholics of Greenwood, Rexville, and Troupsburg...

The old cemetery from the original church... has a stone for Edward Dunne with the date of death recorded as May 13 [*sic*, 18], 1857 age 43...

In order to meet the needs of the Catholics of Troupsburg, a handsome little church was built during the administration of Father James Tuohey, in 1860. It seems to have been located in the area of Young Hickory. However, its use was discontinued when St. Mary's was moved to Rexville in 1870...

In the summer of 1869, Father C.C. McMullen became pastor. One of his first projects was to move the location of the parish church from Greenwood Hill

to the village of Rexville... Some of the supporters of the church building project were... C.N. Dunne. (*St. Mary's Parish, Rexville, New York, Town of West Union* [1995])

EDWARD² DUNN (*Gene*¹), born in Ireland circa 1811 (*1855 NYS Census*) and died on 18 May 1857 at age 43 and was buried in the Old Catholic Cemetery, Town of Greenwood, Steuben County, New York; immigrated circa 1841; married MARY ANN McCORMICK, born in Ireland circa 1817, immigrated circa 1844; farmer residing in Troupsburg in 1855, adjacent to the household of Ignatius and Ruth M. (Shaw) Dunn.

In the 1850 Federal Census for Troupsburg, Edward Dunn's household included Catherine [Lindley?], a 13-year-old native of Ireland.

Edward's estate was administered on 16 February 1858 by executors Mary Ann Dunn, John McCormick and Thomas McCormick (*Steuben County Wills and Administrations*, 4-A:143). His assets totaled \$431.50. By the 1860 Federal Census, Mary Ann "Dun" was the widowed head of the household in Troupsburg.

IGNATIUS THOMAS³ DUNN (*Edward*², *Gene*¹) was born in New York circa December 1845; he was married at St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Rexville, Town of West Union, Steuben County, New York in 1869 to MARY ANNA² "ANNA" KEEGAN, sponsors "*Patricus et Maria Anna Dunn*" (*Register Matrimonium*, St. Mary's, Rexville, NY [hereinafter *SMRM*]). Mary was born in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York circa 1851, died in Troupsburg, New York in 1880, daughter of Thomas¹ and Catherine (Linman) Keegan of Edenderry, Kings Co., Ireland and Troupsburg, NY.

Thomas Keegan also served as a baptismal sponsor for Christopher's only known child. Thomas Keegan's daughter married Ignatius Thomas³ Dunn (*Edward*², *Gene*¹). Given these multiple points of association, it seems likely that Christopher Dunne somehow descended from Gene¹ Dunne of Troupsburg.

In the summer of 1869, Father C.C. McMullen became pastor [of St. Mary's Church]. One of his first projects was to move the location of the parish church from Greenwood Hill to the village of Rexville... Some of the supporters of the church building project were... C.N. Dunne. (*St. Mary's Parish, Rexville, New York, Town of West Union* [1995])
