I am seeking all genealogical and biographical details for the family documented below including their ancestors, children, and grandchildren and the spouses thereof, including the full names of those spouses' parents. All additions and corrections within this scope, however speculative, will be greatly appreciated.

John Shethar of Guilford, Connecticut

THOMAS¹ STREETER (*William^A, Richard^B*), son of William^A and Ann (___) Streeter, was born probably at Dunnings Farm in the Parish of East Grinstead, Sussex, England on 22 [or 25] June 1753 (*bible records in possession of Kaye Evelyn (Kenfield) Hall, hereinafter Hall BRs*). Thomas was christened in the Parish Church of St. Swithun at East Grinstead on 16 June 1754 (*EGPR*); emigrated from London, England to "New Providence," on the site of modern-day Kanona in the Town of Bath, Steuben County, New York in late 1794 and died in Canisteo, Steuben County, New York on 18 September 1831 (*Hall BRs*). Thomas was married second, probably at Bath, New York about 1807, to LOUISA ___, who was born in Connecticut (*1880 U.S. Census, New York, Steuben County* [birthplace of Thomas² Streeter's mother]) 25 June 1773 (*Hall BRs*) and died in Canisteo, New York on 12 January 1844 (*Hall BRs*). She was probably a daughter, sister or widow of one of the other Connecticut pioneers who came to Bath around the turn of the century, perhaps via Eastern New York or Pennsylvania. Thomas was a Baptist Minister; Louisa was probably a Baptist by birth or conversion. Variations of Louisa's name in some records include *Lovica* and *Lovisa*.

Thomas Streeter's nephew, WILLIAM^[2] FAULKNER JR. (*Elizabeth¹ (Streeter) Faulkner*), was born in [East Grinstead], Sussex, England on 28 March 1773. He died on 13 March 1850 and was buried at Lexington, Greene County, New York. Perhaps William was first married to SALLY ANN __ (*Bath, Steuben County, New York, Deeds, 1:92*). He married, perhaps as his second wife, about 1801 ABIGAIL DRAKE, born 30 June 1778, died 1859, buried at Lexington, Greene County, New York.

In the course of seeking the origins of Louisa (___) Streeter and understanding early Faulkner and Drake families of Bath, I have spent some time researching the Shethar family. Unfortunately, I have not been able to solve either puzzle yet. The primary source of information for this chapter is the *Genealogy of the Shethar Family* (New York, New York: C.S. Williams [1904]). The name is frequently seen as *Sheather*, *Shether*, etc.

Statement written by Mary Osborn Hogarth, Nov. 27, 1864, living in 1904 at 550 Washington Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y.:

"My mother, Mary Jane (Shethar) Hogarth, was born in the village of Hammondsport, Steuben Co., NY Sept. 3. 1805. Her father, Capt. John Shethar... My grandfather Shethar owned a very large and valuable farm in the valley in which Hammondsport is situated. He became security for a Mr. William Root of Albany, and lost all his property... When [my Mother] was six years old, Grandfather Shethar moved to Troy, N.Y. After about four years residence in that city, her mother died and was buried there, where also her Aunt Martha Haight died in April and in the September following Grandfather Shethar moved to Alexandria, Va. to reside with his son, my mother's half brother, James Smith Shethar... When my grandfather and mother went to Alexandria, Aunt Betsey **went to Bath to live with Aunt Faulkner, the daughter of my grandmother Shethar by a former marriage with Major Joshua Drake.** They stayed in Alexandria four years... They came 'across country to Bath, N.Y., in a one horse wagon.' ... They remained in Bath, N.Y., six months and then went to Geneva, N.Y. Mrs. James Shethar after her husband's death also removed to Geneva. My mother spent a part of the time with Aunt Faulkner at the hotel and part with Mrs. James Shethar."

Narrated by Miss Elizabeth Hogarth now living in 1904, at 550 Washington Avenue, Brooklyn, N.Y., who had the facts direct from Captain Shethar, her grandfather:

"During the Revolutionary War, Capt. John Shethar was arrested as a spy, taken to New York at a time when the English held only N.Y. ..."

"Capt. Shethar one had for a prisoner a Capt. Williamson, of the British Army, who after he was released, returned to New York and told his wife of the good treatment that he had received at the hands of apt. Shethar. So pleased was she, that while Capt. Shethar was a prisoner, she arranged matters and gave him a grand dinner, and ever afterwards, he was through this influence, treated well. He was visited every day by the young Prince William who admired his sturdy manhood. When released Capt. Shethar called on the Prince."

... Shethar Street in Hammondsport, N.Y. was named for him, he having been granted about one-tenth of the original township.
