This day R. M. Knight Justice - Tallington and James C. Miller personally appeared before the undersigned a Justice of the Peace for said County and were duly sworn agreeably to this above Order

Given under my Hand January 8<sup>th</sup> 1846 J. Hollingsworth J.P.

Agreeably to an Order of the Todd County Court made at the December term 1845 of said Court

The undersigned Commissioners named in said Order after having first been duly sworn conformably to the requisitions of said Order

Proceeded on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of January 1846 to divide the Slaves of Richard Crouch deceased among his heirs and Legal Representatives as follows (To wit)

1<sup>st</sup> We first proceeded to value all of said Slaves in the aggregate and then ascertain what was the portion of each heir which we found to be \$1247.00

1<sup>st</sup> To A. S. Morehead we allotted Patsy and Sam valued at \$575.

He had previously advanced to him his share with out of \$700 which leaves a balance of \$1275 due from him to the other heirs

2<sup>nd</sup> To Joseph Chastian we allotted Sarah and her child valued at \$1100

He had previously advanced to him Slaves to the amount of 125 - \$1225 which leaves a balance of \$2 due him from the other heirs

3<sup>rd</sup> To W. S. Crouch we allotted Willis valued at \$3600

He had previously advanced to him Slaves to the amount of 600 - \$1200 which left a balance of \$47 due him from the other heirs

4<sup>th</sup> To E. M. Poor we allotted Standridge and Rachael valued at \$730 He had previously advanced to

Him alone to the amt of  $\$ 475$   $\$ 1205$   
Which left a Balance due him from the  
Other Heirs of Porty Two dollars

3<sup>rd</sup> To John M. Brouch we allotted  
Jefferson Waty & George valued at  $\$ 1200$   $\$ 1200$   
And a Balance due of  $47$  is due him  
from the Other Heirs

11<sup>th</sup> To Elizabeth E. Brouch we allotted  
Adaline Louisa Thomas  
John and Ephraim valued at  $\$ 1375$   $\$ 1375$
