5007120 The VanDycks have been prominent in America for three hundred years, but, like others of a similar age and standing, much of their early history has been lost. Those who have written up the family genealogies have been greatly handicapped due both to the absence of information and to the confusion in such records as still exist. Errors have crept in and been repeated so often that many people today believe such errors now to be the facts. This state is most unfortunate as it has led to many wrong conclusions.

After much research and study the following information has been assembled to be used, it is hoped, as a guide by the many students of the VanDyck families. It too may have errors, but it is believed that the way has been pointed toward a clearer understanding of the various families of VanDyck who settled in New Amsterdam, and of their many descendants who came to New Jersey. Included are the VanDycks of Long Island, of which there appears to have been three distinct branches, who probably had as their common ancestor one Thomas van Dyck; and the two VanDycks of New York, the family of Frans van Dyck, and Henricus VanDyck, the Fiscal.

Abbreviations are those used by the Genealogical Society of New Jersey. (GMNJ 24:57).

Flatbush Church Records (Fl CR) are from the Frost Collection in the Long Island Historical Society.

2. JAN THOMASSE, son of Thomas (a) b. prob. ca 1605, d. 1673, mar. Tryntje Achias, b. d. . She mar. 2nd Aug. 11, 1678 at Utrecht, Tileman Jacobs Vander Meyen, widower of Teuntje Straetsman.

Jan Thomasse brought his family to America 1652. In 1657 he moved to New Utrecht where he was magistrate for many years.

On Sept. 15, 1661 complaint was made out against Jan Thomassen (van Dyck) of New Utrecht for violently grasping a girl named Clara Gerrits by the throat, and assaulting one Jan van Cleef who would prevent him. On Sept. 22nd Jan Thomassen prtitioned for a pardon but was sentenced to pay a fine of 300 guilders for the assaults. The action for damage by Jan van Cleef was referred to arbitration. (NYCDM p.229)

The Minutes of the Reformed Church of Brooklyn for Sept. 21, 1661 have the following detailed account of the above trouble.

"Jan Thomaszen having been summoned before the Consistory of Breukelen accused of having drawn his knife and of having wounded Jan Van Clefft in the village of New Utrecht acknowledges that he viz. the aforesaid Jan Thomaszen - a half keg of beer having been given on the departure of Mr. Johannes Vervelen, Burger and Brewer at Amsterdam in New Amsterdam got into a quarrel with a certain Claeryie DeMof which ran so high that it came to blows between them and that she tore his shirt. Now the aforesaid named Clefft came up and pulled the aforesaid Jan Thomaszen's hair whereupon the latter drew his knife and gave four cuts in the above named Clefft's jacket and even finally wounding him.

His son Thomas Jansen acknowledged out of filial affection he could not see his father's hair pulled by the aforesaid Jan Van Cleëft, thereupon he, the said Thomas ran to his father's assistance and dragged the said Jan Van Cleëft away by his shoulders. Hereupon the said Van Cleëft also caught the aforesaid Thomas by the hair and Hendrick Mathyssen took him by the feet and both threw him on the ground. But Thomas Jansen hereby declares not to have beaten either one for a second time but only to have caught Jan Van Cleëft by the hair in order to be released.

(a) There is no evidence that either parent of Jan Thomasse came to America, nor is the name of his mother known.

After having discussed the matter we adjudged that Jan Thomaszen who in reality is no member of the Church of Jesus Christ in Breucklen but has at his request enjoyed here the privilege of the communion he belonging to the church at Midwout and living in the village of New Utrecht will be obliged to keep away from the Lord's Table in the Village of Breuckelen because his case is at present before the Hon. Director General and Council, and he is neither reconciled to

the aforesaid Cleeft who is very badly wounded nor to the congregation which would be offended by it. But his son who would be accepted as a member at this place and who showed more repentance will be admitted to the Lord's Table and at the same time warned to take care in the future in this and similar circumstances not to cause offense to the Church."

In 1677 Tryntje Van Dyck was listed as a member of the Flatbush Church from New Utrecht (FLCR Misc. p. 47).

On Dec. 27, 168- Carel Jansz Van Dyck, empowered by his mother Tryntje Van Knipphuysen, conveyed property (New Utrecht Paper No. 4864).

On May 25, 1695, as heirs of Jan Thomasse Van Dyck, Achias Van Dyck of Breukelen, Jan Van Dyck of New Utrecht, Carel Van Dyck of New Utrecht, Peter Staets residing with the jurisdiction of Breuckelen and Arie Bennet living in Breukelen conveyed land in New Utrecht to Rutgert Joosten. Carel Van Dyck signed his name to this conveyance whereas the others put their marks. (Commissioner of Deeds, Kings County, New Utrecht Town Records; History of Deeds, etc. 1659-1831, p. 144, new p. 157).

On Sept. 27, 1662 Agnietie Jans from Amsterdam joined the Brooklyn Church. Witnesses were Jan Thomassen "Whom we have accepted for cause." and Tryntje Agens.

- (b) Other accounts have listed in error additional children including Peter, Dirck, Lambert and Jannetje. Peter Jansen was a Staats who married Annetje Van Dyck. Dirck Janse was actually Dirck Franszen as will be noted by his many children baptised in New York. Lambert Janse, who married Fytje Barents, had only been in America 22 years when he took the oath of allegiance in New Utrecht, 1687 (NYDH 1:660). While Jannetje is given as a witness at the baptism in New York, May 1685, of Barent, son of Achias Van Dyck, she appears nowhere else and it is believed that the name is wrong in the records and that Annetie was meant.

Unfortunately there seems to be no record of Thomas van Dyck or of his wife but they must have been in America as their son Nicolas was born here. It is assumed that they lived in the Yellow Hook. Probably one or the other died about July 2, 1691 when Clas Tomesse of the Yellow Hook paid for the use of the shroud (FlCr Deacon's Notes, p.7).

Thomas Tomasse was a witness at a baptism in New York, Sept. 16, 1717, together with Matje Gollaar, h. v. van Jan Van Dyk, Thia may be Jan #21, son of Achias Jansz Van Dyck.

A Thomas Van Dyck is mentioned in a deed dated July 13, 1720 in Essex County, N. J. This deed conveyed to Thomas Van Dyck and others the property to be used for the Second River (now Bellville) Ref. Dutch Church (SheH p. 881).

- (a) There is no direct evidence that Engeltie was a daughter of Thomas Jansen, but since she was a witness at the baptism of Thomas, #67, son of Andries #18 van Dyck, along with another brother Abraham # 20, and the fact that they all went to Tarrytown indicates close relationship.

Ackeys Jansen in Aug. 1675 was on the assessment rolls for both Breucklen and New Utrecht (NYDH 4:146), and again in Sept. 1676 in Breucklen as Acheys Jansen Van Deick (NYDH 2:477). Haggeus Van Dyck and w. Jannetje Lamberts in 1677 were members of the Flatbush Church from Gowanus (FlCr Hisc. p. 42). As Akus Jansen in Sept. 1683 he was still on the Breuckelen assessment roll (NYDH 2:501). He took the oath of allegiance in Breucklyn, Sept. 1687, having been in America 36 years (NYDH 1:658). In the census of Kings County ca 1698 his family consisted of one man, one woman, and seven children (NYDH 3:135).

CAREL JANSEN VAN DYCK, son of Jan Thomasse and Tryntje Achias, b. 164-; d. 1732-34; mar. June 27, 1680, at New Utrecht, Lysbet Aards vander Hard (Lysbeth Aersen Van Hert) b. ; d. prior to Dec. 1732.

Carel Jansen van Dyck was on the assessment roll Aug. 24, 1675 for New Utrecht (NYDH 4:159) and again in Sept. 1676 (NYDH 2:486). Karel Jansz Van Dyck from New Utrecht joined the Flatbush Church Dec. 1677 and Lysbeth Ards joined Apr. 10, 1680. On Sept. 28, 1683 Karel Jansen van Dyck was once more on the assessment roll for New Utrecht (NYDH 2:506). In Sept. 1687 he took the oath of allegiance, as of New Utrecht, having been in America 35 years (NYDH 1:660).

In the census of Kings County ca 1698 Cornelis (?Carel) Van Dyck is listed as an inhabitant of New Utrecht, the family consisting of one man, one woman and four children (NYDH 3:135). In the New Utrecht census ca 1707 is listed Carel Van Dyck, Lysbert his wife and children Jan, Teunis, Art, Gertien, and Engel (Bergen's Mss. Hist. of New Utrecht, p. 886).

Carel janse Van Dyck removed to Monmouth Co., N.J. and he and his wife were members of the Navesink (Freehold-Middletown) Ref. Dutch Church, there in 1709. Charles VanDike of Shrewsbury, Yeoman, in his will dated Dec. 1, 1732, and proven Mar. 11, 1734, inventory Mar. 3m 1734/5, named son Aurt, dec'd late of Bermudas and his children John, Mary, and Elizabeth; son Thomas, son John dec'd late of Shrewsbury and his children; daughter Mary Gerty Remine and her children, and daughter Angleche Vanwey and her children, The N.J. Archives also records a will of Carel Van Dyck which was dated Dec. 20, 1728 and proven Sept. 17, 1764. Why this earlier will was proven is not clear as it must have been superseded by the will of 1732.

Jan Jansen Van Dyck lived in New Utrecht being on the assessment roll there Aug. 24, 1675, (NYDH 4:159), Sept. 29, 1676, (NYDH 2:486), and Sept. 28, 1683, (NYDH 2:506). In 1677 Jan Jansz Van Dyck and his wife Tryntje Tyssen Van Pelt were members of the Flatbush Church from New Utrecht (FLCR Misc p. 47). He took the oath of allegiance Sept. 1687, as of Breuckelyn, having been in America 35 years, (NYDH 1:659). On Dec. 27, 1689 he was commissioned a Lieut. in New Utrecht by Lt. Gov. Leisler (NYDH 2:351). In the census of Kings Co., ca 1698, as an inhabitant of New Utrecht, his family consisted of one man, one woman, and five children (NYDH 3:134). In 1700 he is listed as being Captain of a Foot Company of Militia, (NYDH 1:360). In the census of New Utrecht ca 1707 is named Jan Van Dyck, his wife Tuenien, and children Jan, Tys, Catlyn, Jannetien and Anggeinet (Bergen's Mss. Hist. of New Utrecht p. 886).

John Van Dyck of New Utrecht signed his mark to his will, dated May 16, 1735 and proved Nov. 9, 1736, on file in the N.Y. Surrogate's office, and names his children, John, Mattys, Catherin, widow of Daniel Hendrickson, Jannetje, wife of Capt. Rutgers Van Vront, and Angennetje, wife of Simon De Hart; his grandson, John Stephens; his granddaughter, Teuntje, widow of John Sleigh; his daughter Catleyntje, dec'd., wife of Garret Kettletas, and their children; his great grandson, under 21, John VanBuren, son of granddaughter Teuntje Richon, dec'd who was wife of Dr. John VanBuren, Jr.

He moved to Staten Island being a resident there in 1680 at the time of his marriage to Jannetje Harmans, who joined the New Utrecht Church in Jany. 1679.

Hendrick Jansen apparently continued to own property on Long Island as he was on the Breuckelen assessment roll Sept. 1683 (NYDH 2:502) and as hendrick Janse took the oath of allegiance Sept. 1687 as of Fflackbush (NYDH 1:659).

Hendrike van Dike registered an ear mark in Richmond County (Staten Island) May 15, 1697 (SHGM 1:26), and Henry Van Dyke was a Freeholder and inhabitant in Richmond County, 1702 (NYCHD Vol. 4; N.Y. Col. MSS. London Doc. XLV, p. 942). He removed to Bucks County, Penna. transferring his church membership to the North and South Hampton Church at Bensalem, Apr. 26, 1704. Hendrick Van Dyck and wife Jannetye hermense were members of the church at Bensalem and Sammeny, 1710 (GSPa 5:34)

The only Rodolphus Van Dyck known to the writer was the son of Peter Van Dyck #215 and Cornelia Van Varik, and grandson of Dirck Franszen Van Dyck. He died after June 1778 and from his will was probably not married. Peter and Cornelia Van Dyck had another son Richard #242 who could have been the father of Rev. Henry Van Dyke.
